WILL MAKE STRONG
PROTEST AGAINST
COMPANY'S PROPOSAL

Evidence Given Before Public Utilities
Commission Re Telephone Rates
Causes Union of Municipalities
to Take Action

Mr. J. W. McCready secretary of
the Union of New Brunswick Munici-
palities has written the mayors of
all cities and towns of the province
to have representatives in attend-
ance at the next session of the Pub-
lic Utilities Commission to be held
in St. John on Wednesday next for
the resumption of the hearing on the
application of the New Brunswick
Telephone Company Limited, for
authorization of reclassification of
exchanges and schedule of rates and
permission to change from one classifi-
cation to another by permission of
the commission but without public
notice of public hearing.

Mr. H. F. Robinson of the
Telephone Company will be present
to give evidence on Wednesday.

Sessions of the Public Utilities
Commission were held at St. John
yesterday, both morning and even-
ing. Mr. Otty J. Fraser, general
superintendent, gave evidence and it
was facts brought out by examina-
tion of him that caused Mr. Mc-
Cready to notify the various mayors
of the province.

OBJECTIONABLE RIGHTS

It is claimed that if the applica-
tion is granted that the N. B. Tele-
phone Company will be in a posi-
tion to increase rates in every town
and city in the province within a
comparatively short time. Any in-
crease is thought to be unjustifiable
and will be opposed. Action in this
matter first was taken by the Fred-
erickton Board of Trade which had
Mr. McCready go to St. John in the
matter.

TOOK CARBOLIC
ACID BY MISTAKE
DIED SOON AFTER

Mrs. Alex Stephenson of Marysville
Lived Less Than an Hour After
Taking Poison—Medical Aid
Proved Unavailing

A tragedy occurred shortly after
noon today at Marysville, Mrs. Alex
Stephenson losing her life through
taking carbolic acid in mistake for
medicine. She was dead within an
hour of swallowing the poison. Mrs.
Stephenson was at her usual em-
ployment in the Marysville Cotton
Mill this morning and at noon went
home as usual for dinner. After par-
taking of a hearty meal she went
to her bedroom where she swallowed
the carbolic acid as far as is
known by mistake for medicine. Med-
ical aid was at once summoned al-
though it was seen that she was
frightfully burned by the acid and
that there was little hope of saving
her life. The doctors were unable to
do anything and death ensued before
two o'clock.

The deceased before her marriage
was Miss Elta Benham of Freder-
icton, daughter of the late Charles


