Liam T. Stead, the brilliant journal-  
ist, Charles M. Hays, Col. John  
Jacob Astor, Isador Straus, of New  
York, Major Archibald Butte, per-  
sonal aide to President Taft; Jac-  
ques Futrelle, the well-known writer  
F. D. Millet, the artist; G. B. Wid-  
ener of Philadelphia, and Harry B.  
Harris, the theatrical manager.Terrible uncertainty even as to the  
condition of the living, still prevail-  
ed and the public clamored for more  
news. Those were days when wire-  
less instruments were put to their  
supreme tests which at once proved  
the high excellence and the short  
comings of modern inventiveness.  
Messages from out New York and all  
along the Atlantic coast bombarded  
the modest Carpathia as throughout  
four days she advanced towards New  
York harbor. And little did the Car-  
pathia reply; her wireless operator  
was busy enough tapping in the  
death list, which grew longer hour  
after hour, and meanwhile erroneous  
or maliciously false messages came  
in from all sources.**A PERIOD OF NERVE WRACKING  
TORTURE.**Never has the whole world labored  
under such nerve-wracking tension  
and awful anxiety as prevailed while  
mourners everywhere waited for di-  
rect accounts of the incredible disas-  
ter, and not until the Thursday  
night of that funeral week did rela-

awaiting the arrival of the Carpathia  
with her cargo of broken hearts,  
those were days never to be forgotten

near to the American metropolis the

when one hour before the Carpathia  
docked a false alarm spread abroad  
to the effect that hundreds of coffins  
had been ordered down to the dock  
to meet the incoming steamer. For  
a while officials and newspaper men  
were prepared for a calamity more  
terrible even than that which had  
been announced.At last the Carpathia was reported  
off Sandy Hook shortly after six  
o'clock on the evening of April 18,  
and a mighty fleet of fast sea-going  
tugs bearing newspaper men from all  
over the continent put out from the  
Battery to meet the steamer on  
which the attention of the world

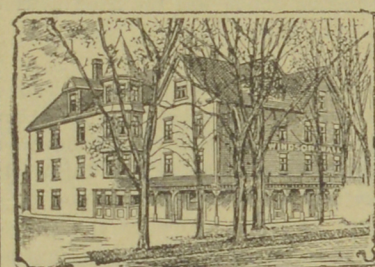

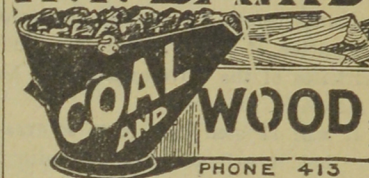
