PUMMPKIN CHIPS.

Pumpkin chips is a preserve. Wash, peel and cut the pumpkin in strips one half inch fourth cup of lemon juice. Put the pumpkin and sugar in alternate layers in a preserving kettle pour over the lemon juice cover and let one half lemon one third cup of epitaph. water and one ounce of ginger root for each pound of sugar.
