### OF INTEREST TO THE WOMEN

#### WINTER CURTAINS EASY TO ARRANGE IF YOU KNOW HOW.

There is a special knack about making Winter curtains. They are different from the Summer ones not nearly so simple to do but so much more effective after all and easy when you know the trick.

You know how some people's curtains look important and heavy and sumptuous and as though they spent just oodles of money for them. And then when you examine them they seem to be made of just ordinary materials? Well these are the stunts to do to make them look important.

Line the inside draperies with sateen or unbleached muslin. Make them very smooth so that the linings fit exactly with never a pull nor a drag in this direction nor in that. Then put heavy weights in the bottoms of the draperies concealing these weights between the outside material and the lining. Then you have something which takes on dignity and weight and which makes the curtain fabric take on an added importance because of the fitting and draping that have gone into the process of making. That is the reason that those curtains you had in mind looked so gorgeous when they were only made of plain stuff like your own.

If you are making a valance for those same curtains that also must be lined and slightly weighted so that it will become of the same apparent texture as the side curtains. And it must be pleated to a board that is fitted to the window so that every appearance of formality shall be preserved.

Often it is a good idea to edge these curtains and the valance with some sort of a heavily woven galoon. It can be silver or gold if the amount you have to spend is very enormous. It is not then it can be one of those woolen woven braids that come for edging and look most elegant against the surface of silk or cotton rep or velvet damask.

Cretonne that stimulates a wood-blocked linen in those darker tones and shadings is good for Winter curtains in living room or dining room. And there is the glazed imported from England which makes the happiest kind of a decoration where the furniture and the rugs are sombre in tone.

#### TRY THIS NEW PRESERVE

The November Delineator publishes such an excellent recipe for a new kind of preserve that it is reprinted here for the benefit of Blade contributors.

#### PUMPKIN CHIPS.

Pumpkin chips is a delicious preserve. Wash, peel and cut the pumpkin in strips one half inch thick. To each pound of pumpkin add one pound of sugar and one fourth cup of lemon juice. Put the pumpkin and sugar in alternate layers in a preserving kettle pour over the lemon juice cover and let stand overnight. Allow the rind of one half lemon one third cup of water and one ounce of ginger root for each pound of sugar. Shred the lemon rind and cook it in water until the lemon rind is tender. Add this to the pumpkin-and-sugar mixture and cook until the pumpkin is tender. Pack in jars. After three days drain off the syrup cook it until it is thick and pour it over the pumpkin. Seal.

#### ULSTERMEN CAMPAIGNING IN SCOTLAND

Glasgow, Nov. 14—The campaign in Scotland, as well as in England and Wales, is being enlivened by the participation of a considerable number of Ulstermen. Large contingents of prominent Ulster residents have been sent to Great Britain's greatest island to present Ulster's claims for consideration. They are working through private interviews with candidates and by making speeches.

The Ulstermen were invited to Glasgow today by Sir Robert Horne, Chancellor of the Exchequer in the Lloyd George Cabinet, who in receiving the delegation told its members he stood by the Anglo-Irish treaty. If any of its provisions were broken the greatest difficulty would be created, he said, and the Free States might afterward reject other proposals, throwing the whole situation into the melting pot. It would be better, he thought, if Irishmen settled the matter themselves, and, although previous efforts had failed, he hoped that with the new state of things a common agreement would be reached.

An appreciable reduction of Ulster would make it unsuitable for efficient administration. This last remark was in reply to Ulster's fears that the boundary commission might reduce Ulster's area.

#### BETTER THAN THE LAIRD, THEY GET HIS CASH

New York, Nov. 15—On the tombstone of the ironmaster, Andrew Carnegie, in Sleepy Hollow Cemetery, is the epitaph he wrote:

"Here lies a man who knew how to enlist in his service better men than himself."

Documents made public today and filed in the appellate division of the Supreme Court in support of an appeal asking that a \$4,500,000 pension fund created by Carnegie's will be declared untaxable, sounded a practical overtone to the keynote of the epitaph.

The documents showed that 600 men and women, most of the more than sixty, and many more than eighty years old, were on the pension list of the Scotch ironmaster, who died in 1919. Some of the beneficiaries receive \$10 a month; others get incomes that approximate \$5,000 a year. Some are workmen grown too old for their trades and others have been downed by sudden misfortune. One is a viscount of London, another is the widow of a railway engineer. But most of them are "men who were enlisted in the service of Andrew Carnegie."

Miss Helen Keller, the famous girl who is deaf and blind, the Carnegie pension fund grants an annuity of \$2,500. Viscount John Morley of Wimbledon Park, London, is provided with £1,000 a year after reaching the age of 80.

The accounting shows that Carnegie gave away \$350,000,000 and died worth \$23,000,000.

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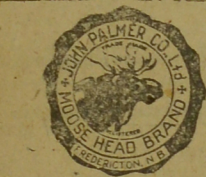

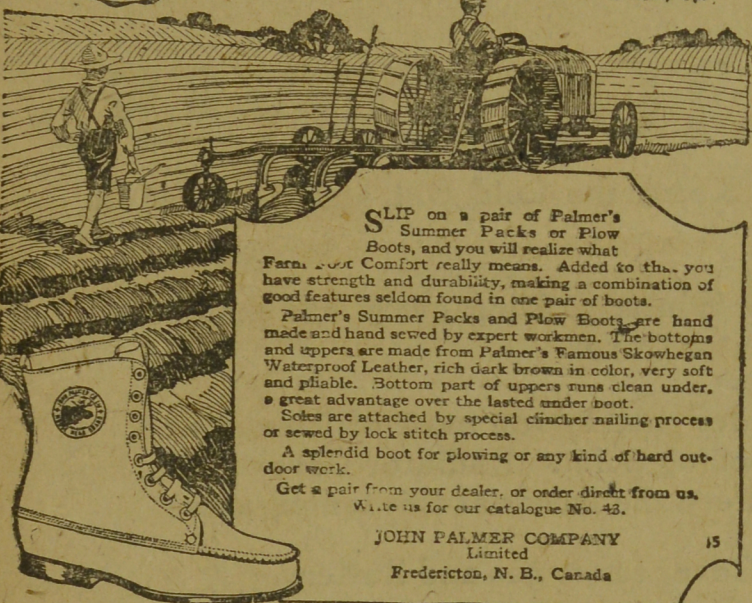

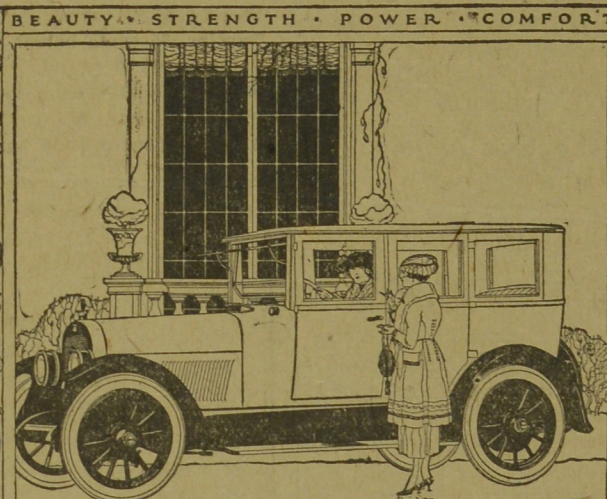
