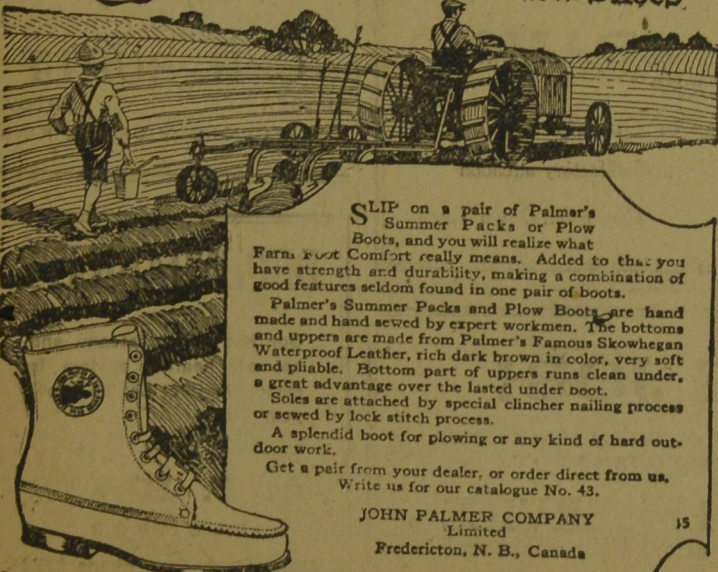

WHICH SAVE MONEY.**

A slice of fried tomato is good served on a flat cake of Hamburg steak.

Try slicing jelly roll in fairly thick slices and pile with whipped cream. It is an easy dessert for summer time as bought jelly can be used.

Add some grated cheese and some chopped mushrooms to the white sauce for fish and note the improvement.

Add ammonia to the water in which you are washing oily, greasy bottles. It will cut the grease and hasten the cleansing.

If you only have a few flowers in the vase and they look a bit straggly put a few corks in the water. They will hold up the flowers and keep them in place.

Save the paper from a bolt of ribbon; it is just the thing to place under thin materials or lace to keep them from puckering when under the sewing machine needle.

A clean sink can be obtained and all stains removed by sprinkling cleaning powder over the stains without wetting the sink. Moisten a cloth with the juice of a lemon and scour the spots well. The sink will look like new.

Set out flowers in a pail of water up to their necks each night if you would have them last.

Open Clams—pour boiling water over hard shell clams and allow them to stand in it for two or three minutes. The shells will then open easily.

By taking a little bit at a time and rubbing over it a brush lathered with soap and water one can clean a rug at home very successfully.

FOR BOUDOIR CAP.

A pretty crochet pattern for a boudoir cap is chain stitched silk with coarse silk and big loops. These are connected to form a coarse diamond net which is then put over a net foundation and finish ed with a banding of shirred blue ribbon to match.

BURNT AMBER FELT.

An unusual hat is of burnt amber felt. In line with the moments' dictum it is extraordinary large and so mushroom in shape that it half conceals the shoulders. The high crown has a draped effect. Through the crown on each side over the ear is thrust a sheaf of stiff quills head down. These come through the underside of the brim almost to the shoulder and are in the dull gold and leaf brown which with burnt amber looks so well.

OPPOSED TO SUNDAY GAMES

Brantford, Ont. Aug. 31—Christian fraternities of the Six Nations Indian Reserve have at last arisen in definite protest of the playing of lacrosse matches on the Tuscorora territory on Sundays. At an open air rally of members of the Delaware Orange Lodge the Indian Orangemen were unanimous in their protest against the Sunday games which are played under the auspices of the Pagan Indians headed by Chief Deskahah and a similar rally is planned for Thursday when the Union Sunday Schools of the Arecorve will picnic to Ohaweken. It is likely loyal Indians declare protest will be made against the Sunday games and loyalists chiefs will be given support at next council meeting.

IN DEMAND PROFESSORS

Berlin, Sept. 1—The exchange of professors between German schools and schools in the Orient has been resumed for the first time since the war. Prof. Hans Driesch of Leipzig and Prof. Wilhelm already have left for China to arrange an exchange of instructors.

Prof. Max Winternitz of the University of Prague and Joseph Strzygowski, author of "The History of Eastern Art", will go to Tagore's school in India.

NOTICE TO TAXPAYERS

On and after August 31st, 1922, interest at the rate of 1/2 of one per cent per month will be charged on all unpaid taxes. This rate means that for the year 1918 and previous years will be charged 24 p.c.; for year 1919 will be charged 18 p.c.; for year 1920 will be charged 12 p.c.; and for year 1921 will be charged 6 p.c.

Interest will be remitted on all arrears paid on or before August 31st. The discount period has been extended to August 31st.

All taxes unpaid after August 31st will bear interest as per above schedule.

Interest at the rate of 1/2 of one per cent per month will be charged on taxes for 1922, beginning September 1st, of this year.

The above interest charges have been ordered strictly enforced by the Finance Committee of the City Council.

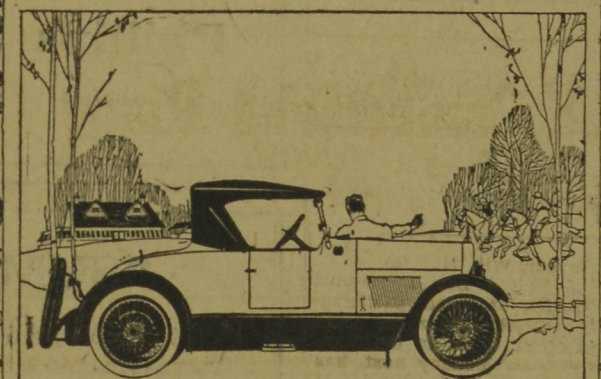
