

On and after August 31st, 1922, In-terest at the rate of ½ of one per cent per month will be charged on all un-paid taxes. This rate means that for paid taxes. This make means that for the year 1918 and previous years will be charged 24 p.c.; for year 1919 will be charged 18 p.c.; for year 1920 will be charged 12 p.c.; and for year 1921 will be charged 6 p.c. Interest will be remitted on all ar-rears paid on or before August 31st.

The discount period has been extend-ed to August 31st. All taxes unpaid after August 31st will bear interest as per above sched-

Interest at the rate of $\frac{1}{2}$ of one per cent per month will be charged on taxes for 1922, beginning September 1st, of this year.


