VERSAILLES
GOBELINS
WERE STOLEN

Paris, Oct. 27.—A sensation was created in Governmental and art circles this morning when it was learned that two great Gobelin tapestries each valued at 1,000,000 francs, had been stolen during the night from the walls of the Versailles Palace.

The guards are certain the tapestries were hanging on the walls last evening when the palace was closed but they were gone this morning.

The tapestries were made in 1674 and formed part of Louis XIV’s collection one of them represented the siege of Douai and the other the entry of the King into Dunkirk.

The police found traces indicating the thieves had climbed a lightning rod to a window breaking the glass and then releasing the latch into the Salon de Mercure. They took the tapestries off the wooden stretching frames and carried them to an automobile waiting in the garden.

Another valuable tapestry in the same room was left untouched. The stolen tapestries weighed seventy-five pounds each and measured nine by sixteen feet.

DEFIANT MAN
WAS RAISED
BY THE JUDGE

Atlantic City, Oct. 26.—Brazen of frontery on the part of Preston Smith thirty-five colored of this city convicted yesterday in Judge Smathers’ court at Mays Landing of assault and battery resulted in his sentence being raised from five to eight years then from eight to fourteen years and an additional fine of \$4,000.

If the prisoner cannot pay the fine he will serve one day for each dollar almost eleven years.

After he had received his first sentence and had been turned over to the county jailer Smith said to one of the constables: “When I have served my sentence I intend to get even with the man who testified against me. He was returned immediately to the courtroom. Judge Smathers asked him if he had made the threat. Defiantly Smith replied that he had.

“I will reopen this case and raise your sentence to eight years” said the court. “Thank you” sneered the prisoner. “For that remark and your attitude I will raise your sentence to fourteen years and add a fine of \$4,000” said the judge.

“Thanks” the prisoner reiterated. “Your sentence carries with it hard labor” was the Court’s parting shot.
