He cleaned up the mess left by his predecessors and has inaugurated and carried cut progressive policies which have given the province a long forward stride. While he is to give up the leadership all will be glad to know that he is to retain his seat in the Legislature, and in all probability will remain a member of the new administration

Hon. Mr. Veniot, who is to succeed to the premiership has been in public life since 1895, although not continuously.
