

WILL OF LATE
HAVELOCK COY
PROBATED

Late Registrar of the University of New Brunswick Left \$10,000 to Widow, Personal Property and Insurance.

The will of the late Havelock Coy registrar of the University of New Brunswick since the year 1903, and who died suddenly here several weeks ago, was probated before Judge H. G. Penety in the Probate Court here during the past week. Letters testimony were granted to Helen J. Coy, the widow, executrix named in the will.

Valued At \$6,280
The estate was valued at \$6,280 of which \$4,500 was real and the balance personal. Besides the above, life insurance to the amount of \$3,800 was left to the widow. Under the will the entire estate is left to the widow of the deceased.

In the estate of Miss Grace A. Wilson, deceased, of Bloomfield Ridge, letters testimony were granted to the executors, John A. Hunter, and John T. MacDonald. The estate was sworn at \$4,800, consisting of \$4,000 real and the balance, \$800 personal property.

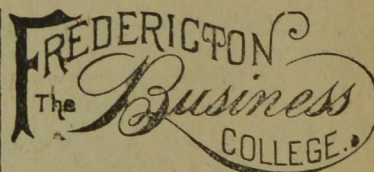
