

HOPE TO SET UP  
CENTRAL FISHING  
UNIT SOON

Deputy Minister of Fisheries W. A. Found of Ottawa in City Today—Talked on Atlantic Fisheries—To Get Honorary Degree

Among those upon whom will be conferred honorary degrees this year by the U. N. B. Senate will be W. A. Found, Deputy Minister of Fisheries, of Ottawa, Ont., who arrived in the city today for the encaenial exercises. The deputy minister of Fisheries was accompanied by his wife.

Interviewed by reporters at the Queen Hotel at noon today, Mr. Found commented on the Atlantic fisheries. The Department of Fisheries, he said are hoping to establish a central fishing organization in the interest of co-operative production and control in the Maritimes. "The fishing industry", said Mr. Found, "is rapidly emerging from its postwar depression in the Maritime provinces, and generally along the Atlantic coast into a reasonably prosperous condition."

Steps to have a Maritime headquarters for this co-operative fishing unit, will probably be completed by the end of June, the official said today.

**Was Unfinished**

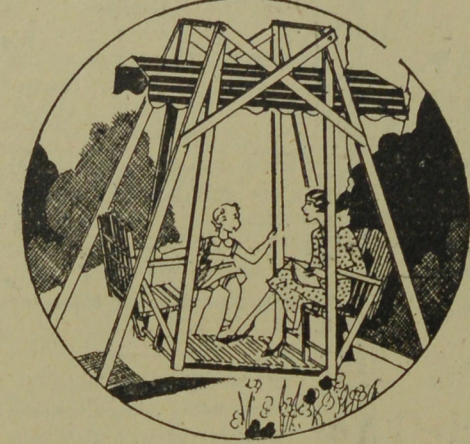
