

THE VICE REGAL PARTY TO VISIT HERE OCT. 22ND.

Viscount and Lady Willingdon Now on a Tour of the Maritimes—Include Fredericton in Their Itinerary—Notable Event.

Their Excellencies Lord and Lady Willingdon, now on a tour of the Maritime Provinces, will pay a visit to Fredericton on Wednesday, October 22nd, according to an announcement made this morning by Capt. Theodore Barker, Secretary to His Honor the Lieutenant Governor. They probably will arrive by special train from Saint John early in the afternoon and will take their departure in the evening. A program for the entertainment of the distinguished visitors is now being arranged. Their Excellencies made their first visit to Fredericton three years ago, and the Governor General made an informal visit here two years ago. On the last occasion he had a round of golf on the Fredericton links and did some hunting in the vicinity of Oromocto.

New York Fur Prices
New York autumn fur prices this month as compared with the May, 1930 sales, were as follows; black bear, no change; racoon, one per cent lower; mink 10 per cent lower.

Court Adjourned
The September session of the York Circuit court today was adjourned until Tuesday, October 21, by Mr. Justice Crocket. The three criminal cases on the docket—two of them concerning the high crime of murder—have been completed, and only three civil cases remain.

Spoke Last Night
Dr. J. L. Biggar and Miss Jean E. Brown, national officers of the Canadian Red Cross Society, were speakers last night at the Fredericton High School building. Dr. Biggar told of the work which the Red Cross was doing in the Dominion and urged the support of the public.

Left Hospital
Leonard Agnew, son of Gerald Agnew of Victoria Mills, who suffered a broken leg a few days ago, was able to leave the Victoria Hospital today and go to his home. An x-ray examination of the injury showed that the young lad would be able to leave the institution. Young Agnew fell from a tree near his home, while playing with his boy friends.

Week End Market
A slump in the price of chickens and lamb featured the week-end market this morning. Lamb by the hind quarter sold as low as 18 cents while chickens went off to 35 cents. Butter sold at 33 cents per pound and eggs at 35 cents. Potatoes were down to \$1.75 per barrel and turnips to \$1. Beets sold at 20 cents per peck, carrots at 25 cents, and fresh pork at 26 and 18 cents. Other prices were about the same as last week.

Some Scare
Police and citizens got a scare last night when word got about that Mr. and Mrs. George Bartlett, local residents became lost in their car, and failed to turn up at their residence. It appears that the two became lost on the Hanwell Road and after turning and twisting about the road for several hours, could not find a way out. Motorists went in search of the couple and finally located them. Needless to say, both Mr. and Mrs. Bartlett were some nervous and mystified when found. The mystification also is part of the citizens' mixed feelings too. Mr. Bartlett is not much like his famed cousin, Captain Bob Barker, who on one occasion explored far into the depths of the Arctic Ocean, and made himself famous.

ISABEL CARR, 18 YESTERDAY WAS ACQUITTED OF MRS. CLARK'S MURDER

York County Court Judy Out 3 Hours and 20 Minutes—Throngs About the Court House and Inside Cheer Accused As She Appears Outside a Free Girl—Mr. Justice Crocket Charged Isabel to Change Mode of Life in Future.

On the occasion of her eighteenth birthday, Isabel Carr, Geary, servant girl, was presented with the gift of her life by a York Circuit jury, trying her for the murder of Mrs. Mary Elizabeth Clark, her aged mistress, who was found cruelly murdered on August 7th at her home in Brunswick Street. The jury deliberated a period of 3 hours and 20 minutes. Loud cheering filled the courtroom, as the foreman of the jury, Douglas Clark son, of Nashwaak Village, read the verdict—"We find the prisoner at the bar not guilty." The verdict was brought in shortly before ten o'clock. Hundreds of persons filled the courtroom and hung about the outside of the Court house last night, waiting for the verdict. When Isabel Carr appeared and was whisked away in a car, a free girl once again, the crowds cheered lustily. No emotion was shown by the accused on hearing the verdict of the jury. She sat in the prisoner's box, and a faint rather mysterious looking smile played on the corners of her lips. "Stand Up," Mr. Justice Crocket ordered after her counsel moved for discharge of the prisoner. Isabel stood up slowly fastening her coat. "You have been found not guilty by this jury on this charge," Mr. Justice Crocket said. "They have given you the benefit of the doubt. "In discharging you I wish to warn you against the life which the evidence shows you have been leading—an immoral, dissolute life. Better Reflect "You had better return to your home and reflect upon what is sure to be the consequences of such a life if you continue it—very serious consequences to you." (Continued on Page Five.)
