

FIRE LOSS AT MAGAGUADAVIC ABOUT \$7000

Saw Mill Owned By F. H. Bourque Completely Destroyed, But Most of the Lumber Was Saved—No Insurance on Mill.

As announced in yesterday's Mail a rotary mill at Maguadavic Station on the C. P. R. was totally destroyed by fire early yesterday morning. The mill was the property of F. H. Bourque of Kent County and was operated under contract for J. M. Scott, M. L. A. of this city, who is carrying on extensive hardwood operations at that place.

The fire broke out at three o'clock in the morning and with a strong wind prevailing, the mill was soon a mass of flames. The mill crew turned out promptly and removed to a place of safety a number of box cars partly loaded with lumber. As the wind was blowing towards the lake a quantity of hardwood lumber and ties stored on the opposite side of the mill escaped damage. In all about three hundred railway ties were destroyed.

The loss to Mr. Bourque is estimated at \$6000 and he had no insurance on the mill. The lumber which is owned by Mr. Scott was insured and his loss is estimated at \$1000.

The fire will cause considerable inconvenience to Mr. Scott as he had on hand about three hundred thousand feet of logs yet to be sawn. Had the fire not occurred he would have finished work in about three weeks.

To Pick Candidates
The Opposition forces in York are to meet here tomorrow to select four candidates for the Legislature. The names mentioned of possible candidates include His Worship Mayor Clark J. J. F. Winslow, K. C., and J. B. McNair of this city, Elwood Burr and P. S. Watson of Devon, C. W. Anderson of McAdam and H. C. Greenlaw of Millville. Mr. Burr stated today that he would not allow his name to be submitted to the convention for business reasons.

Deceased was well known and highly respected and her death will be learned in all sides with sincere regret. The funeral will take place on Sunday afternoon from the home of her sister, Mrs. Yeoman's at 1.30 o'clock, following which the remains will be taken to the Baptist church at Lower Maugerville, where Rev. Mr. Bell will conduct another service at 2.40 o'clock. Interment will be made at Upper Maugerville.

Dance, Salute to Graduates and Auto Accident Figure in Finis to University of New Brunswick Year—Many Visitors.

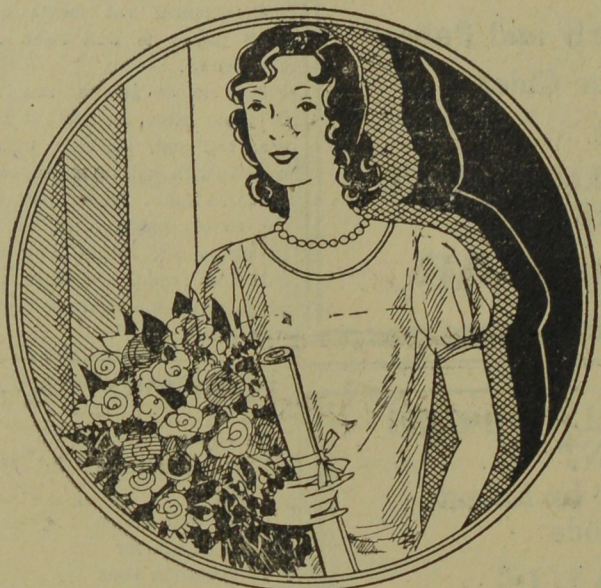

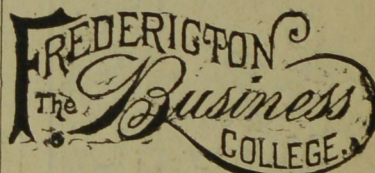
