



Fishway Was Removed

The temporary fishway in the dam at Marysville was removed yesterdey by order of officials of the Department and the old concrete structure which has been dry since early in the fall, was put back on a war Cooting. There are quite a number of salmon in the river at the present time but unless the gates of the dam are lifted the chances are that few of them will reach the spawning grounds A number of salmon succeeded in negotiating the temporary fishway but it was not a success by any means It would seem that the problem of getting salmon past the obstruction at Marysville is yet to be solved.
