RETAIL MERCHANTS' ASSOC. MET LAST NIGHT

Will Send Delegates to Rally at
St. John This Month--Banquet
Proposed Some Time in Oct.

A meeting of the Retail Merchants' Association was held last evening in the Board of Trade Rooms, President A. Murray presiding.

After matters of regular routine business were disposed of, a committee was appointed to interview members regarding attending a rally of the Retail Merchants of the Province of New Brunswick to be held in St. John on Sept. 19th and 20th.

At this meeting it is intended to deal with conditions of trade and developments after the war.

It was also proposed at last evening's meeting to have a business men's banquet some time in October.

VICTORIA CROSS FOR GALLANT AVIATOR

London, Sept. 5.—King George today awarded the Victoria Cross to Lieut. William Leefe Robinson, of the Royal Flying Corps, for bringing down a Zeppelin while the airship was approaching London Sunday night.

The British official press bureau, in making the announcement, says that the cross was awarded to Lieut. Robinson for the most conspicuous bravery.

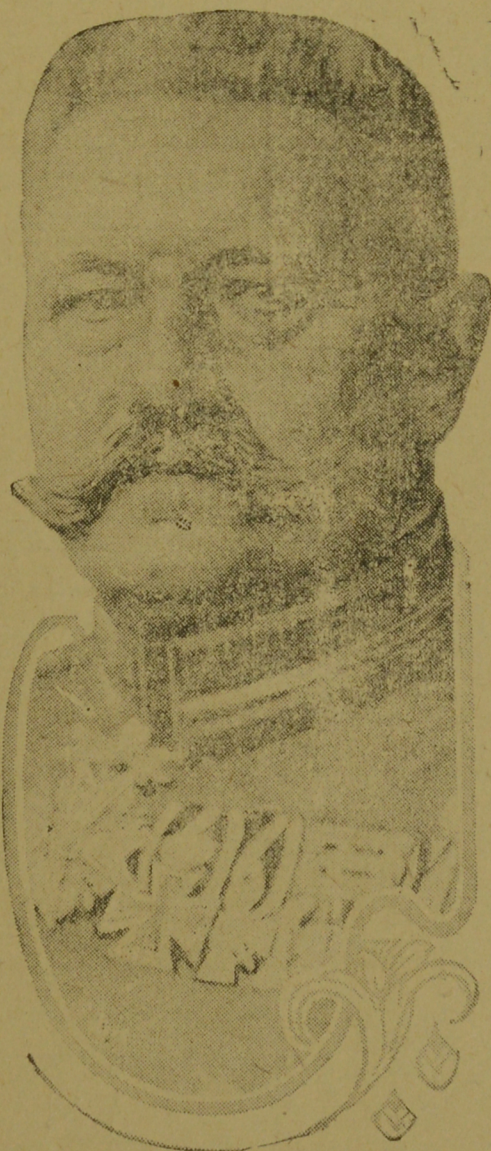
Robinson, the statement adds, attacked the Zeppelin under circumstances of great difficulty and danger, and sent it crashing to the ground, a flaming wreck.

Robinson had been in the air for more than two hours, and had previously attacked another airship.

INTENDING SOLDIERS TO HAVE FREE OPERATIONS

Victoria Hospital Trustees Will Meet
Colonel Guthrie's Sugges-
tion.

The monthly meeting of the Hospital Trustees was held yesterday with President VanDine in the chair.

August was a busy month in the hospital, and according to the Superintendent's report seventy-nine patients were treated, and there were two deaths.

The contagious wing has been occupied almost continuously during the summer, and one patient is there at present.

In the correspondence considered was a letter from Lieut. Col. Guthrie, O. C. 236th Battalion, referring to the fact that many young men present themselves for overseas service, but because of some slight defect are unable to pass the medical examination. The Colonel suggests that perhaps the hospital authorities, under such conditions, would give them free treatment for minor operations. He also informed the Board that Dr. C. P. Holden, of this city, had consented to operate free of charge on any man of the 236th.

After weighing the matter on all sides, the Secretary was instructed to inform Lieut. Col. Guthrie that the Trustees fully appreciate his desire to remove every obstacle to the enlistment of boys willing to fight for their country, and that the Trustees will provide ward accommodation so far as space can be controlled, for all young men unable to pay for treatment.

A letter was read from Dr. W. J. Weaver, one of the visiting physicians, asking for leave of absence for overseas service, and suggesting that Dr. G. V. VanWart would be willing to perform his duties at the hospital in the meantime. The request of Dr. Weaver was granted.

The Secretary-Treasurer read a letter from Mr. P. J. Hughes showing that he had collected a note due the hospital, and enclosing the amount due.

The unexpected absence of Mr. H. G. Kitchen was explained when the Secretary on his behalf asked for leave of absence.

His Worship the Mayor and building committee were authorized to make necessary repairs upon the roof of the old building.

After disposing of several other matters the meeting adjourned.
