CITY COUNCIL TURNED DOWN PROPOSAL OF FINANCE COM.

this offer. On his motion the matter was referred to the Finance Committee.

Resolution on Pensions.

A resolution passed by the City Council of Niagara Falls, Ont., to the effect that officers and men of the Canadian Expeditionary Force should be placed on the same footing in the matter of pensions, was read.

Ald. Burnett, seconded by Ald. Barker, moved a resolution to the same effect. The resolution was carried.

Patriotic Fund.

The matter of raising money to meet the deficit in the Patriotic Fund by assessment was brought up.

Ald. Burnett contended that this money should be raised by a bond issue and not by assessment.

Ald. Lemont did not agree with him. The burden was not heavy. The country was prosperous and could well stand the burden of keeping up the Patriotic Fund. The present generation, and not the future, should bear the load. It was not like public buildings, permanent streets, etc. On his motion the matter was referred to the Finance Committee.

Ald. McLellan said that Ald. Burnett's suggestion was a good one. His arguments were sound. Taxation at the present time was grievous. Ald. Lemont had remarked that Fredericton's tax rate was lower than that in other towns, but he did not say that valuations in Fredericton were higher than in those other places. He urged that the Finance Committee carefully consider the suggestion of Ald. Burnett.

Ald. Everett agreed with Ald. Lemont in believing that the burden should be borne at the present time by

assessment.

Arrears in Taxes.

Ald. Wilkinson brought up the matter of arrears in taxes. He moved that all arrears of taxes on property remaining unpaid after September 15th be collected by the sale of the property. The motion was lost on the following vote:

Yea—Lemont, Wilkinson, Everett, Shea.

Nay—Baxter, Barker, Walker, McLellan, Burnett.

Those voting against the motion said it was too drastic.

Ald. Wilkinson said that the effect of the motion was to deprive the Finance Committee of power to collect taxes, and to give the chairman of that committee a slap in the face. There were properties in Queen street which were six and seven years in arrears. There was no other way to get the money except by threat of sale.

Ald. Lemont said that if those who opposed the motion knew of the conditions they would withdraw their opposition.

Ald. McLellan said the motion was too drastic. It would result in injustice to many persons. If those who were in arrears for only one year were not included in the motion he would view it in a different light.

Ald. Burnett said that he wished to protect the poor people who might be in such a position that they were absolutely unable to pay their taxes.

Mayor Mitchell said Ald. Burnett did not understand the taxation situation. He evidently did not know that there were well-to-do people who had made a practice of letting their taxes remain in arrears in order to use their money to their own advantage. It was people of this class who were imposing upon the people who did pay their taxes.

Ald. McLellan moved that the mat-

ter be referred back to the Finance Committee for further consideration.

Ald. Walker seconded the motion. He had opposed the former motion because it was too far-reaching. As a matter of fact, the Finance Committee had the power itself to sell for arrears in taxes any property that it deemed advisable. He remembered when the late City Treasurer advertised properties for sale for taxes without consulting the City Council.

The City Treasurer stated that the intention had not been to proceed to collect taxes for 1916 by the sale of property.

Ald. Baxter said that had the matter been discussed in committee a different view would have been taken by him.

The motion to refer the matter back to the Finance Committee was carried.

Miscellaneous Business.

The Water Committee was empowered to lay a six inch water main on Argyle street from Westmorland toward York, and also to install sewerage in the same street.

On the motion of Ald. Shea it was decided that the city shall bear the expense of constructing curbs, gutters and sidewalks at street corners.

Ald. McLellan, seconded by Ald. Walker, moved that section 8 of the market by-law be annulled. Under this section the selling of meat in smaller quantities than quarters had been forbidden.

The motion was carried.

Ald. Wilkinson drew attention to the unsightly condition of telegraph and telephone poles about the city. The by-law relating to this should be enforced.

On his suggestion the City Clerk was instructed to notify the various companies to act in the matter.

Ald. Walker moved that the appointment of William Saunders as a city constable be cancelled.

The motion was carried, and the Council then adjourned.

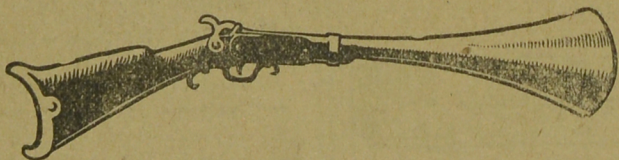
