

WILL SEND ITALIANS HOME.

Germany Will Return 10,000 Civilians Unfit for Military Service.

Paris, Oct. 23.—Germany is about to expatriate 10,000 Italian civilians who are unfit for military service, and who have been interned in Germany, according to news despatches from Rome.

It is stated that the German authorities lack the means of feeding the prisoners and will send them home by way of Chiasso.

LONDON OPINION ON STEUERGHK.

Assassination an Austrian Movement Against Berlin Domination.

London, Oct. 23.—The morning papers print long editorials on the assassination of Premier Steuerghk. The general opinion expressed is that the removal of Steuerghk is the work of those who wish to free the Austrian government from a clique of politicians who are largely controlled by the Hungarian Premier Tisza in the interests of the Magyars and Germany.

On this theory the assassination is held to represent the Austrian movement to escape from the domination of Berlin.

A LEAGUE TO MAINTAIN PEACE.

Viscount Grey Approves of American Proposal.

London, Oct. 23.—In the course of an important speech at a luncheon given by the foreign press association today, Viscount Grey, British Secretary for Foreign Affairs, expressed approval of American movements for a league after the war to maintain peace.

He declared, however, that the nations which went into such a league must have a public sentiment prepared if necessary, when a critical time came, to uphold their decision by force.

DISEASE STILL ON INCREASE.

Twenty-eight Cases of Infantile Paralysis in Montreal.

Montreal, Oct. 23.—Six new cases of infantile paralysis have been reported in Montreal and district since Saturday. No additional deaths were reported today and medical authorities express the opinion that the situation is well in hand.

At present there are twenty-eight cases in Montreal and district. There were six deaths in Montreal last week and eight in Westmount.

BRITISH CAPTURE MORE HUN TRENCHES

One Thousand Yards North of the
Somme River Taken on
Monday.

London, Oct. 23.—More than 1,000 yards of German trenches in the region of Guedecourt and Lesboeufs were taken by the British in fighting north of the Somme river in France this afternoon, according to the official communication issued tonight. It is at this point that the British lines are nearest Bapaume, so that today's capture cuts down still further the two miles remaining.

The communication says: "This afternoon, in the course of operations by the right wing of our army south of the Ancre, we advanced our line east of Guedecourt and Lesboeufs and captured more than 1,000 yards of enemy trenches."

"During the day our front in the neighborhood of Le Sars was heavily shelled. South of Grandecourt this afternoon the enemy massed for an attack, but was stopped by our artillery. Sixty-six further prisoners are reported as a result of the fighting at the Schwaben redoubt and LeSars, in addition to the total given yesterday."

"Last night two German raids were attempted against our trenches in the neighborhood of Gommecourt. One was stopped by our first, and the enemy suffered heavy casualties. The second penetrated our outpost lines, but was promptly driven back by our counter attack."

"Yesterday our aeroplanes bombed two railway stations behind the enemy's lines, hitting a train in motion and doing much damage to buildings and rolling stock."

"Seven enemy air machines were brought down, and many others were forced to land in a damaged condition. Eight of our machines have not returned."

SUCCESSFUL WORK ON EGYPTIAN FRONTIER

London, Oct. 23.—Successful operations by British camel corps on the Egyptian western frontier have resulted in the clearing of hostile forces from large areas and the capture of some 175 prisoners, says an official statement today on operations in Egypt.

Armoured cars operated in connection with one of the camel detachments. The statement reads:

On Oct. 22nd, on the western frontier, camel corps detachments operating with armored cars, successfully swept the Dakhla oasis to its western edge, capturing 175 prisoners after some opposition.

"A similar operation on the same date in the Sahara oasis, 100 miles west of the Nile, by camel corps detachments, resulted in the capture of fifty prisoners, including one officer and a quantity of war material."

A DANISH AND A DUTCH VICTIM.

A Steamer of Each Nationality Reported Sunk—Loss of Life Feared.

London, Oct. 23.—The sinking of the Danish steamer Hebe and the Dutch steamer Fortuna, of 1,254 tons gross, was reported today at Lloyd's shipping agency. Ten survivors of the Fortuna were landed. The captain and fifteen others, it is feared, were drowned.

It was also announced that the Donaldson Liner Cabotia, of 4,309 tons gross, was believed to have been sunk. The Cabotia was 385 feet long and was built in 1900.

WESTERN FARMERS TO FORM NEW PARTY

Saskatoon, Sask., Oct. 23.—The organization of a farmers' non-partisan political league is being attempted in Saskatchewan, and already, according to one of the organizers, nearly two thousand farmers have paid \$15 each into a common fund. It is stated the organization will attempt at the next election to secure a majority in the Legislature on a platform including government ownership of flour mills, elevators and packing plants and rural credits.

PRODUCE PRICES IN THE BOSTON MARKET

(Boston Transcript.)

Chinese cabbage has been added to the list of salad vegetables at 15 to 20 cents a pound, ordinary cabbage selling at 10 to 20 cents each for drum-head, red or Savoy.


White potatoes are unchanged at 45 cents a peck, with sweet potatoes at 5c. lb., Texas onions at 10c., native onions at 10c. a quart.

Bunch beets bring 8c. bunch, bulk beets 10c. a quart, parsnips 7c., carrots 6c. a pound and turnips 5c. a pound for white and 4c. for yellow. Cauliflowers is especially good just now and fine specimens are offering at 25 to 35 cents each, with egg plant at 20 to 25c., and oyster plant at 15c. a bunch.

Pickling material is still in plentiful supply, pickling onions selling at 15 to 20 cents a quart, pickling peppers at 10 cents, green tomatoes at 40c. peck, and pickling cucumbers at 50c. to 75c. a hundred, according to size.

Brussels sprouts are selling at 20c. a quart, pumpkins at 20c. to 30c. each, summer squash at 10c. each, marrow, turban and Bay State squash at 6c. a lb., and green corn at 30 to 40 cents a dozen ears.

In the way of salad vegetables, lettuce, chicory, escarotte, romaine, leeks and mint at 10 cents, water cress at 5 to 10 cents, radishes and parsley at 5 cents, green peppers at 25 to 35 cts. a dozen, hothouse tomatoes at 15c. a pound, field tomatoes at 10c., celery at 15 to 25 cents, cucumbers at 10 to 15 cents each, string beans at 15 cents a quart for green and wax, Lima beans at 12½ to 15c. a pound.



Tuberculosis Rapidly Increasing Among Children of Belgium and Northern France.

More Food Urgently Needed to Keep up Their Strength

An interview with Mr. W. L. Honnold, American Director of the Belgian Relief Commission, brings to light a new danger threatening the population of the territory occupied by Germany.

Mr. Honnold reports that about 5,000,000 wholly or partially destitute people, who have been dependent on the Commission, generally show diminished vitality. The effects are most apparent among the older children, particularly those in the adolescent stage. Among these there is an alarming increase of tuberculosis, due to the lower power of resistance consequent on an inadequate diet.

To overcome this serious danger, the Commission appeals for extra contributions so that a special meal can be served every day in the schools. Efforts are also being made to provide as far as possible for children outside the schools.






