## MINISTERS OF RAILWAYS WILL PRACTISE ECONOMY

Hon. Frank Cochrane Says Expenditures on Government Railway System Must be Curtailed Till After the War—Minister, General Manager Gutelius and Staff Arrived by Special Train Last Night.

Curtailed of expenditure, on the Canadian Government Railway system until after the war, except in cases of absolute necessity, was the keynote of the remarks made by Hon. Frank Cochrane, Minister of Railways and Canals, last night to a joint delegation from the Fredericton Board of Trade and the City Council.

The Minister arrived by special train last night, accompanied by Mr. F. P. Gutelius, general manager of the Canadian Government Railways, and their staffs. The train came from St. John over the C. P. R. Owing to the stay in St. John being longer than was anticipated, the train did not reach here until after seven o'clock. It left again at about 9.30, the minister and party being bound for Quebec via the Intercolonial and Transcontinental.

### Delegation Heard.

The delegation assembled at the Board of Trade office and went to the private car of the Minister, which was on a siding near the I. C. R. station. Mayor Mitchell, Ald. Everett, Ald. Reid and Ald. Lemont represented the City Council, and the Board of Trade was represented by President J. S. Neill, J. D. Palmer, Dr. C. Jones, John Neill, C. W. Whelpley, J. T. Jennings and R. B. Hanson.

Mr. James H. Crockett also waited upon the Minister as chairman of the patronage committee.

President Neill acted as spokesman for the delegates. The conference was entirely of an informal character. Some complaints were made of car shortage. Both the Minister and Mr. Gutelius ex-

plained that all railways, both in Canada and the United States, were suffering a similar shortage. Mr. Gutelius said that the Intercolonial was holding on to all the cars it could, and by meeting 50 per cent. of the demands of shippers was doing all possible.

President Neill informed the railway officials that Fredericton merchants were generally satisfied with the service given by the Government Railways, and that the recent railway development in the province had put Fredericton in an excellent position as a jobbing centre.

Discussion on the necessities of the I. C. R. equipment in Fredericton ensued. Hon. Mr. Cochrane stated that with the extension of the St. John and Quebec Railway to St. John the Department would be in a better position to know the requirements of Fredericton in the matter of equipment. Heavy expenditures could not be expected in any part of the Canadian Government Railways. The great necessity was to keep Canadian troops in the field, and everything else must be subordinated to the defeat of Germany and her associates.

Mr. Gutelius spoke of the necessity of a heavier bridge at Fredericton to carry the heavy engines which would be used when the St. John and Quebec Railway would be in full operation.

The Minister of Railways also discussed the matter of overseas freights and forecasted the establishment of a transatlantic steamship service in connection with the Canadian Government Railways system.

### BRITISH STEAMER MIDLAND SUNK.

LONDON, Oct. 24.—The 4200 ton British steamer Midland has been sunk. The Midland was 380 feet long and built in 1913. She was owned in London. She sailed from Capetown on September 17th.
