## WOMAN'S COLUMN

RECIPES WORTH TRYING.

### Brambles.

One coffee cup of raisins chopped fine with 1 lemon and 2 crackers, 1 cup sugar, 1 egg, 1 cup milk. Mix thoroughly. 1 put raisins, crackers and lemon rind and pulp through meat chopper. Make a paste of 3 cups flour, 3 heaping tablespoons lard, 1 teaspoon salt and water to make it right to roll. Cut in circles, put a spoonful of

mixture in center, fold together after wetting edges, so they will stick together, or an easier way is to take half of pastry, thin and put in bottom of large biscuit tin. Spread with mixture and cover with rest of pastry. Cut in squares when taken from tin.

### Smothered Codfish.

Pick boiled codfish free from bones and shred it fine. To 1 pint of boiling milk add 1 tablespoon

of butter and 2 tablespoons of flour rubbed together. Moisten with cold milk. Stir it until it boils and thickens. Have ready 2 eggs, beaten light, pour the mixture on them and beat until well mixed. Place a layer of bread crumbs in the bottom of a dish. On this place a layer of fish sprinkle it with pepper and cover with a layer of sauce. Repeat until the dish is filled. Cover the top with bread crumbs and bake 20 minutes. This makes a delicious dish.

### Tomato Mince Meat.

Four quarts green tomatoes, chop and drain. Cover with cold water and simmer 30 minutes; then drain again and add 2 pounds brown sugar, 1 pound raisins, 1-2 citron chopped, 1-2 cup butter, 1-2 cup vinegar, 1 teaspoon salt, 1 teaspoon cloves, 2 teaspoons cassia, 1-2 teaspoon nutmeg. Cook slowly about two hours. I grind the tomatoes and raisins with the meat grinder, using the coarsest knife. Put a handful of raisins on your pies when you make them. This is very good and could hardly be distinguished from real mince meat.

### Gingerbread.

Melt one-third of a cupful of butter in two-thirds of a cupful of boiling water, add 1 cupful of molasses and 1 egg well beaten. Mix and sift 2 1/2 cupfuls of pastry flour, 1 1-2 teaspoonfuls soda, 1-2 teaspoon salt, 2 teaspoonfuls ginger. Add to first mixture, beat thoroughly, turn into a buttered and floured shallow pan and bake in a moderate oven 30 minutes. I hope this is what you want. It is a recipe from a famous cooking school lecture, although no claim is made that it is economical.

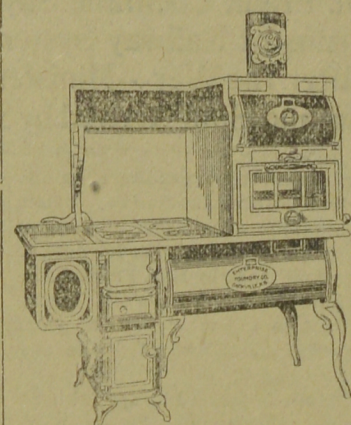
All employers of labor in said district willing to give preference to returned disabled soldiers as employees and all returned discharged soldier wanting employment residing thereto are requested to notify the secretary.
