ONE MAN KILLED, ANOTHER INJURED

Two Grand Trunk Freight Trains in Rear End Collision Near London, Ont.

London, Ont., July 26.—Conductor Cutting, of Bridgeburg, was instantly killed and brakeman C. Stone, of the same place, probably fatally injured by a rear-end collision of through Grand Trunk freights early this morning, just west of this city.

Engineer Wrigley and Fireman J. Webb, both of Fort Erie, were painfully hurt, but will recover.

The accident is said to have been due to lack of protection being furnished by the first train, which had stopped. A heavy mist was prevailing at the time. The engine of the second train crashed into the caboose of the first train, reducing it to splinters, and throwing four cars into the ditch.

province about \$8,000 for interest on moneys borrowed from the provincial funds. This statement of the government press is either true or false. If true, ex-Premier Tweedie should pay over \$8,000 and if, upon investigation, we find that it is true, we will go after the money.

"Dr. Pugsley for many years has been the target of the government slanders in connection with the Central Railway. I do not think there is a word of truth in them. I know that the counsel of the Central Railway investigating commission made a report which declared that there was nothing in such a statement. But in spite of that legal opinion—an opinion which was suppressed for political purposes—again and again, in our own Legislature and in the House of Commons, it has been made to appear that Hon. William Pugsley and the government of which he was a member, were responsible for an alleged deficit of \$134,000 of Central Railway funds. Don't you think it is about time the people had the truth and that these slanders ceased?"

"The Opposition, and I speak with authority on this occasion, does not propose to whitewash the political sins of its friends or its enemies. We are going to get all that belongs to this province no matter who—friend or foe—has it. I have the promise of my associates that this will be done and the people can rest assured that it will be done."

"My time is too short to deal with the Opposition reform policy; of our intentions concerning management of the crown lands and the placing of the roads in the hands of the people and the making of permanent highways. I hope to speak to you many times at many places and when you hear all that we propose to do for you and for the province, when you think of the deception and the rascality that have characterized the government of the day, then I will leave it to you to make a choice, to decide between right and wrong, to work and strive for better government."

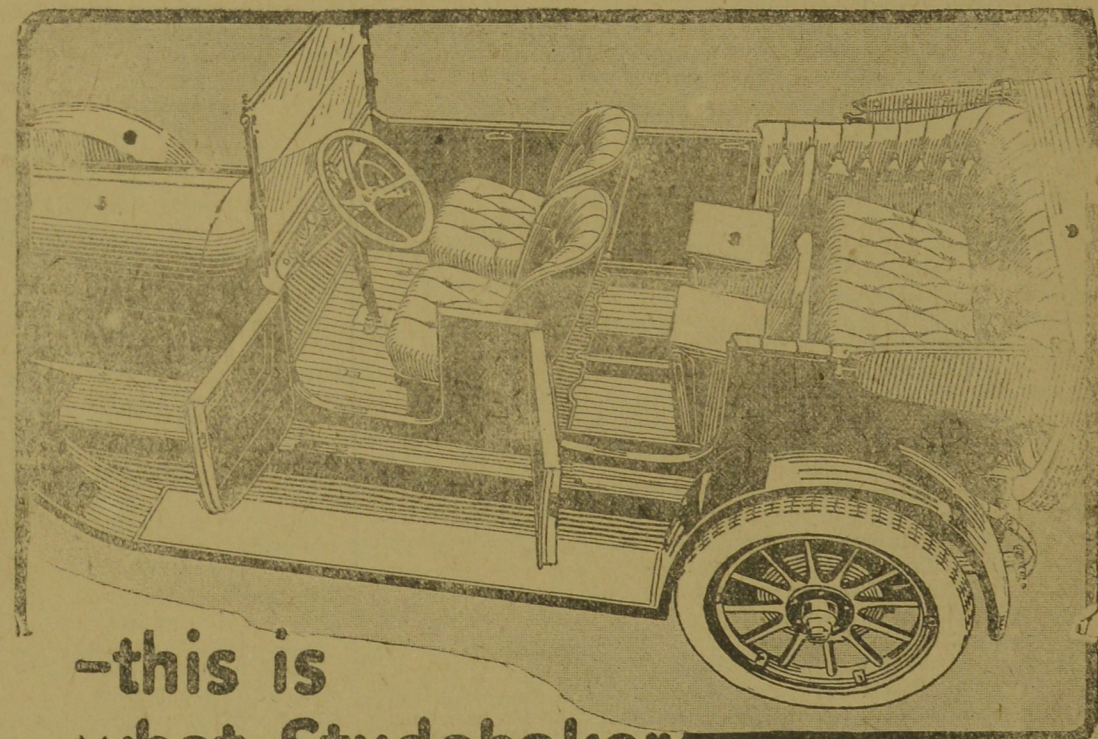

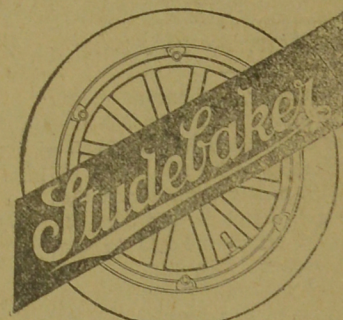

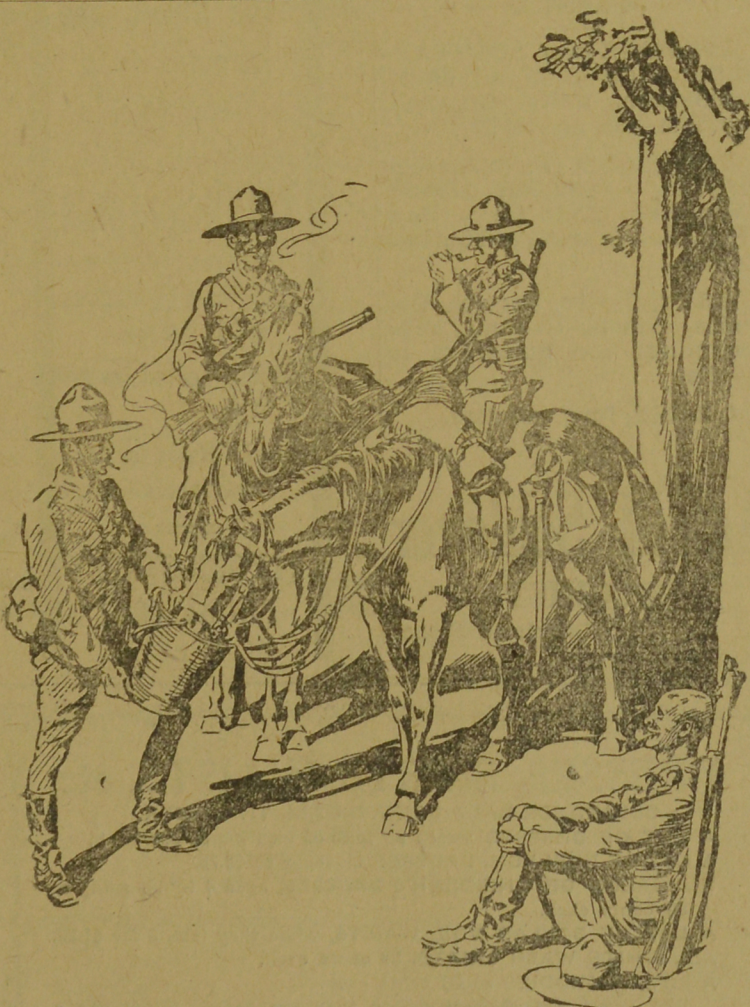
