New York, Jan. 19.—The Greek lin er Vasilons Constantinos arrived here today from Athens with 300 Serbian soldier, refugees and their fimilies, on

As soon as the liner reached quarantine twenty of the Serbians were taken off and sent to the quarantine hospital. The quarantine physicians declined to make known the nature of their illness, pending further diagnosis. Most of the refugees were said to be reservists who were living in this country at the outbreak of the war and were summoned back to the colors.

Physicians later announced that the twenty persons removed were afflicted with vermin of the type that carries typhus and would be kept under observation.
