Half Million Dollars the Purchasing Price—Suit of Federals Remains to be Withdrawn.

Chicago, Jan. 20.—Formal transfer of the Chicago National League Baseball Club from Charles P. Taft of Cincinnati, to Charles H. Weeghman of Chicago, was completed today with the presentation of a certified check for \$500,000, the purchase price by Mr. Weeghman to Charles Schmalstiz, personal representative of Mr. Taft.

President John K. Tener of the National League, said the National League had the purchase price by Mr. Weeghman to but had not been called on for it.

Only the withdrawal of the injunction suit, brought by the Federal League, pending before Federal Judge Landis, remains to end the baseball war.

SERBIAN REFUGEES
REACH NEW YORK

New York, Jan. 19.—The Greek liner Vasilons Constantinos arrived here today from Athens with 300 Serbian soldier, refugees and their families, on board.

As soon as the liner reached quarantine twenty of the Serbians were taken off and sent to the quarantine hospital. The quarantine physicians declined to make known the nature of their illness, pending further diagnosis. Most of the refugees were said to be reservists who were living in this country at the outbreak of the war and were summoned back to the colors.

Physicians later announced that the twenty persons removed were afflicted with vermin of the type that carries typhus and would be kept under observation.
