## OFFICIAL CANADIAN GOVT. FILMS COMING TO F'TON.

"Canada's Fighting Forces," the official Canadian government war film, will be shown in Fredericton for two days at the Gaiety Theatre, by means of a special arrangement which the management has just made. Accompanying the picture will be an interesting talk by Corporal White, D.C.M., hero of Ypres and St. Julien, who will tell a thrilling story of the life of Canadian boys in khaki at the firing line, and of the bravery and heroism which have won them such respect. The films are in six reels, and were made by Lieut. D. J. Dwyer in Europe for the department of militia, as a record of the war. These showed in such a splendid manner the real life of Canadian soldiers that it was decided to show them at once to the public, and the showings in Montreal, Ottawa and Toronto have met with huge success. They will be particularly interesting locally, as several hundred Maritime Province boys are clearly recognizable in the films, including the 12th Field Battery, in training at Shorncliffe. Of course the most interesting portion of the films are those showing trench work, bursting of bombs in the trenches, an attack on the enemy, and the throwing and bursting of hand grenades only forty yards from the camera. But fascinating, too, are the scenes showing the Duchess of Connaught's Canadian hospital at Clivedon, the care of the wounded there and at the Queen's Canadian hospital, and the splendid work of the Canadian nursing sisters. The visit of Sir Robert Borden and Sir Sam Hughes overseas was recorded, and Major Generals Turner and Carson are also prominent in the picture. A review by His Majesty the King

shows forty thousand Maple Leaf troops at one time and the visits of President Poincare and gallant King Albert are also worth seeing. Through out six reels there is not a moment that does not hold and please an audience and inspiring martial music, from a special score, accompanies each scene. The performance in Ottawa was attended by Their Royal Highnesses, the Duke and Duchess of Connaught and the Princess Patricia, who highly commended both Lieut. Dwyer, who took all the pictures, and the speaker for his highly interesting explanation of the various scenes.
