(Continued from page one.) Ottawa, Nov. 13 .- Sir Sam Hughes nd the Government have finally brok en. As the culmination of long con tinued and steadily increasing fric tion between the Minister of Militia and his cabinet colleagues over quesions of appointments, patronage, po itical expediency and joint ministerial esponsibility, General Hughes today ccepted the Prime Minister's suggesion that the resignation of the Minister of Militia might be forthcoming, and shortly after noon the resignation vas placed in Sir Robert's hands.

The writing of the resignation folowed an exchange of letters between he two containing charges and counter charges.

Although it was suspected in the apital that the resignation was comng, it was thought right up to the last be patched up. Finally, however, Sir Sam took the plunge, wrote the letter of resignation and sent it by a trusted friend and official to the Prime Minis-

er's office Sir Robert accepted the resignation nd his first official business with the ew Governor General this afternoon vas to formally place before him the esignation of one of his advisers-the one who should have been the most important in time of war.
