



"Why, I never heard of such a thing," said John. "The idea of getting quotations from a doctor; it's the asylum for you."

'Well now, why not? I am a specialist in printing and publicity. I study my business just as carefully as any doctor can do. If I do say it that shouldn't, I have just as much brains as the average doctor. I strive to give my customers the benefit of my knowledge, my artistic skill and judgement and my ideas on publicity.
