CHILDREN RESPONDING TO BELGIAN APPEAL

Schools Have Raised More Than
\$1,500 so Far.

The appeal to teachers and pupils of the schools of the province to raise money by entertainments, etc., for the Belgian Children's Relief Fund, has met with a very hearty response.

A number of schools, chiefly in rural districts, have already held their entertainments, and have forwarded their contributions to the Education Department, although the official date named by the Board of Education is the 15th of November. A very large number of the country schools as well as most of the city schools are yet to be heard from.

The amount of money already received is over \$1,500. The receipts for this week alone, up to date, are about \$800. So far the largest sum has been received from Kings county schools—nearly \$400 having been received from that county. The next in order of merit is York county, with something over \$300.

A post office order was received yesterday for \$89 from districts Nos. 6 and 7, Brighton, teachers, Miss Bessie A. Parent and Mrs. Viola G. Lund.

STEAMERS WERE IN COLLISION AT SEA

New York, Nov. 9.—A collision at sea with a vessel under fled was reported by the French line steamship Espagne, which arrived here today from Bordeaux after a rough voyage. Two days off the French coast, at 11 p. m. on October 31, the Espagne sighted a steamship dead ahead with no lights burning, apparently.

Owing to the stormy weather, the two ships were unable to escape coming together, the Espagne's bow crashing into the side of the stranger, which suffered an eighteen-inch gash. The vessels swung about until their sides scraped. The Espagne stood by and offered assistance, which was refused, and the ships parted company. The Espagne was only slightly damaged.

Many Applications From Members of

Allen, of this city, to the position of provincial librarian, vacated by the death of the late Mr. Abram Alward. The new librarian is a sister of Hon. J. D. OFFICERS OF 22ND MANITOBA BATTN. COMING

Lieut. Col. Lightfoot, officer commanding the 22nd Manitoba Battalion, C. I. F., will come to Fredericton this evening, accompanied by Capt. Bingham and Lieut. Grant, also of the same unit. All these officers were formerly members of the 10th Battalion and will be entertained while here by Lieut. Col. Guthrie, of the 236th, who was also an officer of that unit. The officers of the 22nd will return to St. John tomorrow by automobile.

A dinner will be held for the visitors at the officers' mess this evening at 8.30, and a general reception will follow. In the 10th Battalion Lieut. Col. Lightfoot was in command of D Company and was wounded while leading the second wave in the desperate battle at Ypres on April 22, 1915.

Capt. Bingham was temporarily in command of A Company of the 10th Battalion while in France, when his senior officer, Major Ashton, was wounded. Capt. Bingham was in a very serious condition for a long time after he was wounded, being in hospital for seven or eight months while five pieces of shell were being removed from his head.

Lieut. Grant was sergeant major of the 10th and was blown almost to pieces at the battle of Festubert by a big shell, having one leg, an arm and a number of ribs broken, while he was otherwise terribly maimed.
