### OF INTEREST TO WOMEN

#### HOUSEHOLD HELPS.

To remove ink stains from wash materials pour a tablespoonful of kerosene on them and rub them well. Then rinse in kerosene and the spots will disappear as if by magic. This should be done before the regular washing.

When the steel parts of a kitchen range become brown, dampen a small piece of cloth in ordinary vinegar and rub the parts affected. The brown tinge will very quickly disappear, and then the usual polishing may be done with a most pleasing result.

When kitchen sash curtains are inclined to stick to the window with frost and steam, fasten a cord across the lower part of the sash with tacks in each corner. The curtain never clings to the window and keeps much cleaner.

Coffee is superior when made with cold water, as this method extracts the oils more quickly and effectively. Cook the coffee but a few minutes after reaching the boiling point, or the oils will be quickly dissipated and the coffee will be flat and without aroma.

When it reaches the boiling point an egg shell, a little of the white of an egg or a teaspoonful of cold water will precipitate the grounds. A small bit of butter makes the coffee rich and smooth.

To make tough steak tender put three tablespoonfuls of salad oil and one tablespoonful of vinegar on a large flat dish. Lay the steak on the mixture and let it rest in this way for half an hour. Then turn it over and let it rest another half hour in the same quantity of vinegar and oil.

The toughest steak will yield to this treatment and be tender when served.

#### TO CLEAN GLASSES.

A thick paste made of baking soda and water is excellent for cleaning glasses in which milk, ice cream or other greasy substance has been standing. When there is no time to make a paste, if the fingers are dipped in water, then in dry soda, and the greasy part is rubbed around with them, the marks will quickly disappear and the glass become bright.

Lamp chimneys treated in the same way will shine, while if the lamp burner is boiled for half an

hour in soda and water it will cause the lamp to burn with renewed brilliancy.

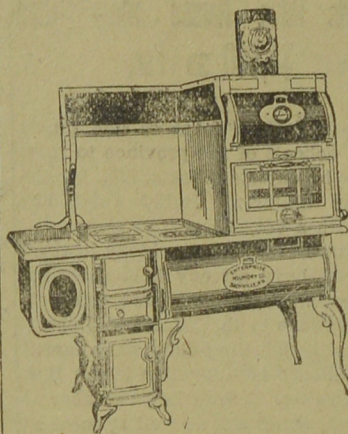
