Speak Before Gathering of Amateur Players and Delegates at National Baseball Federation.

Cincinnati, March 10.—At a meeting of the rules committee of the National Baseball Federation today recommendations were decided upon to divide amateurs into two classes. It will recommend that Class A be composed of strictly amateurs and Class B of those who accept money for playing baseball, but who do not take up baseball for a livelihood.

The committee will also recommend championship series for both classes and intercity series.

A great meeting of amateur players and delegates to the convention was addressed tonight by August Herrmann, chairman of the National Commission, and Ty Cobb.

MAKES IMPRESSION

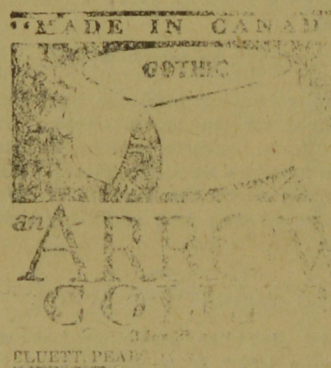
His Work in Outfield and At Bat Magnificent—May Crowd the Older Players Out.

Americans Were On  
Torpedoed Ship

Paris, March 11.—Seven of the crew of the Norwegian barque Silius, which was torpedoed and sunk yesterday, were Americans. The Silius left New York February 4 for Havre.

The Petit Parisien says that one of the Americans on the Silius was injured seriously in his legs and was taken to the Pasteur hospital. He is John Hartmann, 18 years old. The Silius was a 1,500 ton three-master, formerly the British bark Helly. It is reported that Captain Sylvertsen of the Silius was drowned and that two sailors are missing. The remaining members of the crew were saved.

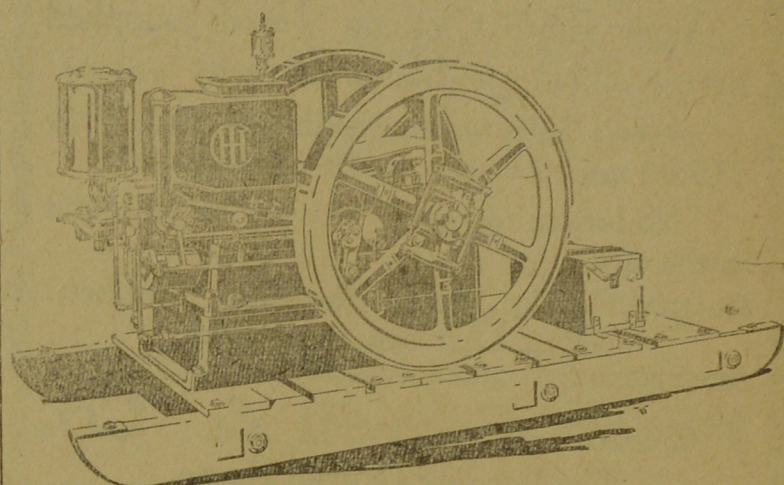

"Why, I never heard of such a thing," said John. "The idea of getting quotations from a doctor; it's the asylum for you."

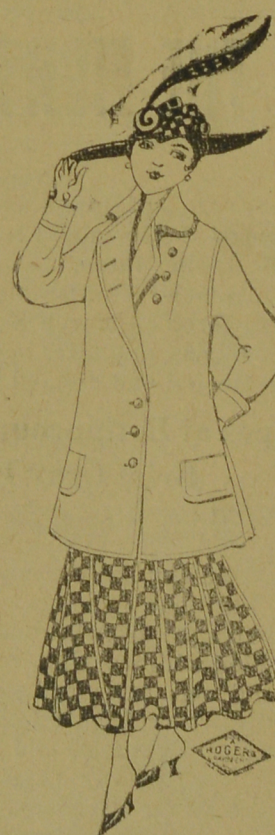

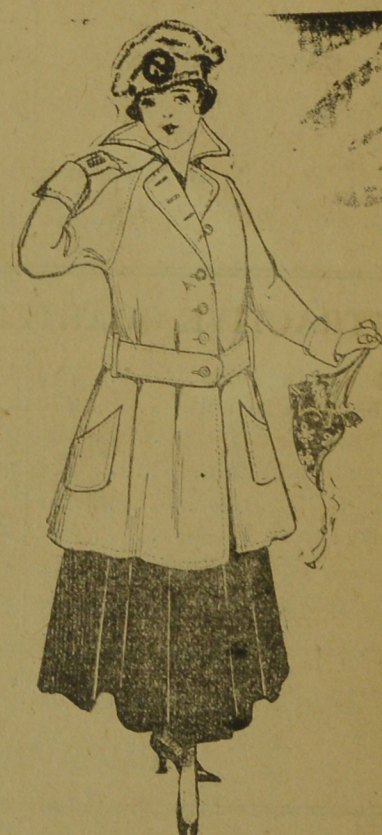
