36TH BATTERY WILL  
LEAVE FREDERICTON  
WITHIN FORTNIGHT

Orders Expected At Any Time -- Officers  
Taking Final Leave -- Four More  
Recruits Sworn in  
Here.

It is definitely stated that the 36th Field Battery will leave Fredericton on its way to England within a fortnight. The date of departure is later than what had been expected originally but is said to be definite. Orders from Halifax relative to the departure of the Battery are expected at any time.

## RUMORS CURRENT.

There are numerous rumors current as to the use to be made of the barracks after the departure of the 36th. One has it that a company of the 140th Battalion, now in process of organization, will be quartered there. Another is that a new field artillery battery will be raised in this province and will be quartered in the barracks. Lieut. McGrath, Lieut. Donald and Lieut. Vickery are attached officers of the 36th Battery and will not go overseas with it. It is reported that they will be used in the organization of a new battery.

INTERESTING CASE  
BEING HEARD IN  
CHANCERY COURT

W. P. Lunt of Springfield, Mass.,  
Brings Action Against George A.  
Perley, M. P. P., For Value  
of Standing Timber

The case of Lunt vs Perley began in the Chancery Court this morning, his honor Judge White presiding. The case has interesting features. The plaintiff is Mr. W. P. Lunt of Springfield, Mass., and the defendant is Mr. George A. Perley, M.P.P. for Sunbury. Mr. P. J. Hughes of McLellan & Hughes, is representing the plaintiff, and Mr. R. B. Hanson of Slipp & Hanson, the defendant. The latter was on the stand this morning. Mr. Hughes, in presenting his case before the court, stated that Mr. Lunt owned at the present time and had resided upon the so-called Holden farm near Oromocto. Some eleven years ago he left the farm and appointed the defendant his agent to collect rentals and manage the business in connection with the property. After some time he authorized his agent, Mr. Perley, to sell the standing timber on the property. The reply to Mr. Lunt had been that the value of timber was about \$150 and advising him to accept an offer of \$125. After some negotiation, Mr. Perley's offer of \$200 for the standing timber was accepted by the owner. The year following Mr. Perley disposed of the timber for \$500. The contention of the plaintiff is that the
