MUNITION WORKERS

NOT TO BE ACCEPTED
BY RECRUITERS

Chemists Placed in Same Class--
Must be Reported to Central
Authorities First--More Re-
cruits Have Been Enrolled

The practice followed in the British Isles of discouraging the enlistment of munition workers in the army, has been adopted by the Canadian authorities. The local recruiting office has received instructions to the effect that men employed in the manufacture of munitions are not to be enlisted and that men who are liable or able to be so employed are to be reported to the central recruiting authorities before being enlisted. Chemists are not to be enlisted before being reported to the central authorities.

Regulations with regard to medical examination of recruits have been made less exacting as far as recruits for home service are concerned. Slight defects in the way of varicose veins and flat feet are to be overlooked.

Instructions also have been received to enlist men for the Mechanical Transport units. Mechanics and also motor-drivers are wanted for these.

It was decided that the building would be erected on the site of the Auld Kirk on York street which was removed from the corner of George and York streets at the time the new stone edifice was erected. Mr. Brammer of New York, the leading architect of Sunday School buildings in the United States, has been retained by the Messrs. Fraser to design the building. The latter will be the most modern and the best equipped building of its kind in the Dominion. In its equipment will be a number of unusual features.

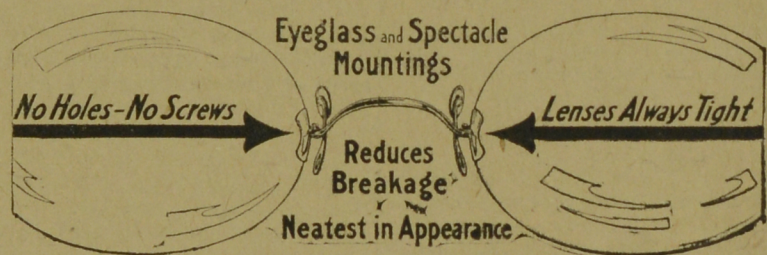
Mr. Archibald Fraser was elected trustee of the church to complete the unexpired term of his father, the late Donald Fraser.

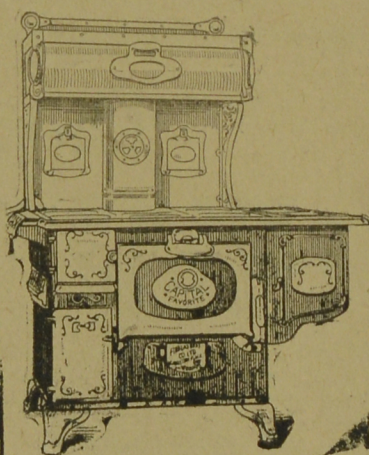

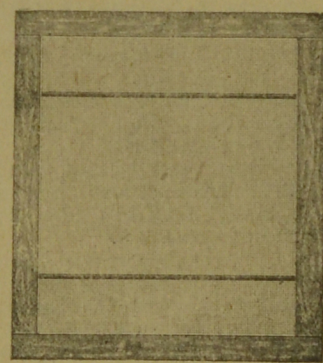
