## ROGERS LAYING THE BLAME UPON THE ARCHITECT

Says the Latter Was Responsible for the  
Destruction of the Walls of the Parlia-  
ment Building at Ottawa---Means a Loss  
To the Country of Two Million Dollars.

(Toronto Globe.)

Soundness of moral character and a reputation for unimpeachable honor and truthfulness are chief among the assets of a man in public life, and especially in the fierce light that beats upon a man having control of the greatest spending department of the Government of Canada.

There are times when all that is left to a man is his own sense of personal integrity within, and the confident assurance that the outside public will hold him innocent until sifted evidence proves him guilty.

Had Premier Borden been willing to learn anything from the experiences of former Prime Ministers, and strong enough to use what he learned, he would not have risked his government's good name, his country's interests, and his own leadership by putting the Public Works department into the hands of a man with the character and the public reputation of Hon. Robert Rogers.

No matter what may be proved on investigation—and searching investigation there must be—the man in the street today, Conservative and Liberal alike, discounts, indeed utterly disbelieves, the Minister's alleged story

about the demolition of the walls of the Parliament Buildings by the architect without the knowledge or authority of the Minister himself. An architect guilty of such conduct would be a subject not only for immediate dismissal and prosecution, but for examination by an alienist. And after 28 years of distinguished and honorable services in all parts of Canada, no one thinks Architect Pearson either crooked or crazy.

Unfortunately, the reputation of the Minister of Public Works, at any point along the trail from southern Manitoba obscurity, round by election manipulations and government building construction in Winnipeg, and on to his record since 1911 at Ottawa—that reputation and record do not warrant public condemnation of the architect based on any unsupported statement of the Minister.

But another thing: the demolition of the walls, for whatever reason, makes impossible the authorized "restoration" of the buildings. The construction of new buildings has not been authorized by Parliament or, even by the Parliamentary "restoration" committee. For this reason the members of that committee, as they value their reputation

for honor and honesty in public service, ought not any longer to submit to dictation from the compromised Minister. And they ought to insist on public tenders and honest contracts. Whatever excuse or pretext there was for the "percentage-on-cost" plan has now vanished. That plan ought to be abandoned. For a new building it has no defence except for its graft opportunities. The public would feel a little safer were all such opportunities rigidly closed.

This also is a case in which appeal should be made, if needs be, directly and publicly to the Prime Minister. He is supremely responsible. It will not do to allow the scandal of his easy irresponsibility for the Minister of Militia to attach also to his attitude to the Minister of Public Works. Apart altogether from the grossness of the scandal, it is putting the whole fabric of responsible government in Canada into serious peril.

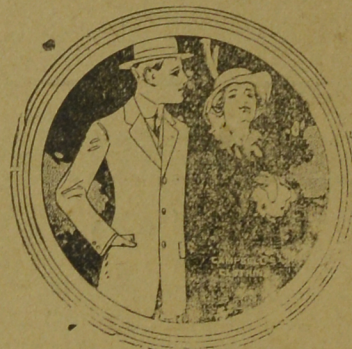

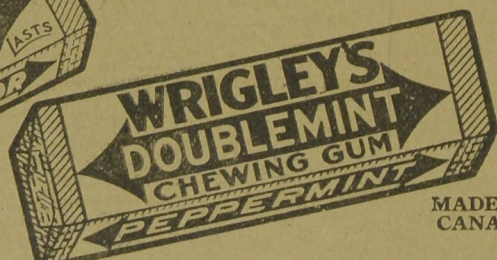
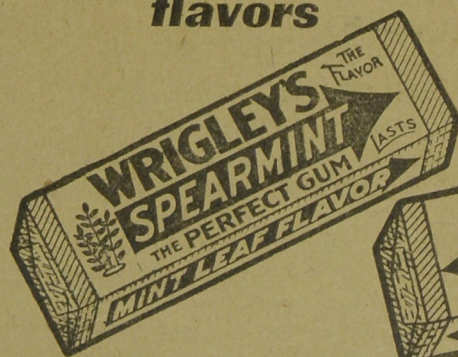
