FISHERY MATTERS UNDER DISCUSSION

Sir Joseph Pope Conferring With
Secretary Lansing at Wash-
ington.

Washington, Aug. 28.—Sir Joseph Pope under-secretary for external affairs of the Canadian Government has arrived in Washington to discuss with Secretary Lansing, the alleged refusal of the Canadian government of the right to American fishing vessels to get supplies at Dominion points.

It is understood that before the end of the week W. A. Pound, Canadian Superintendent of Fisheries, will also come here to help settle the dispute. Reports so far are that the Canadian fisheries department has refused batt, ship's stores and supplies to American fishing vessels which take their catch to any port where it cannot be shipped over Canadian railroad lines.

The object of the Canadian government is apparently to divert the whole fishing trade to the North Pacific into the hands of agents of the British government. At the British embassy it is stated Sir Joseph Pope's mission is to take up several questions with the American government, but what these are has not been stated.

RECIPES WORTH TRYING.

This calls for a cup of sugar and a half cup of butter creamed together. 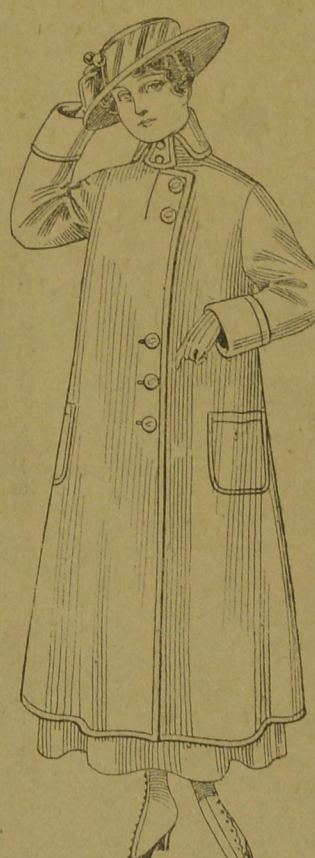
