NEWEST SPORT SKIRTS.

The separate skirt is with us once again and this season's models are lovelier than any that have gone before. For instance, one of heavy cream-colored silk with broad stripes of pale green.

Another is of French pique, finely ribbed in soft rose and white.

Taffeta skirts are much worn with separate blouses, and of mohair skirts there is no end. But the latter are as little like the old stiff mohair as anything that can be imagined, being, instead, soft and silky.

All of these skirts are plaited or gathered to give fullness and are ornamented with pockets and pearl buttons.

Skirts of cream-colored satin worn with blouses of crepe de chine

or oforgette crepe, and over all a sport coat of bright color or lined with some bright-tinted satin, will be the prettiest "sports" dressed this summer.

TO PERFUME HER HAIR.

A delightful way of imparting a delicate scent to the hair is to let it filter through in the form of steam. This sounds pifficult, but it is not at all. Simply fill a small bowl with boiling and pour some of your particular perfume upon it. The two liquids will not mingle, but if you hold your head over the bowl the steam of the water will carry the scent with it and permeate the hair in a most satisfactory way.

Providing one is careful to remember that the charm of scent lies in its over exclusive character that it should be so faint as to be preceptible only to one's subcon-

sciousness, as it were—a girl should adopt a perfume as her own, and see that all her belongings receive their share.

LEMON SYRUP.

Lemon juice, 1-3 cup; sugar, 1 cup; ice-water, 2 cups.

Boil water and sugar together 12 minutes, add lemon juice and cool. The syrup will keep several days in the refrigerator, when needed add ice-water.

PINEAPPLE SALAD.

One-half can pineapple, strain the juice and boil same very sweet, and cool; then add one egg, beaten, pinch of salt, one tablespoon vinegar, tablespoon cornstarch, diluted, small piece butter. Boil this very slow, stirring and leave stand until cooled. Take four bananas and cut in dice, four or six apples cut in dice, add pineapple, white grapes and maraschino cherries. Take one half pint of cream and whip; put this in custard and whip all together, then pour over fruit, leave stand until ready to serve on ice.

NEW SYSTEM OF RECRUITING TO BE ADOPTED

Ottawa, Sept. 25.—The amended regulations in regard to the new system of recruiting now being inaugurated in Canada were finally announced today in an official statement.

Sir Thos. Tait was recently appointed to supervise the new system. Provision is now made for boards of national service, under the director general, in each military district, and by way of conserving in the country the labor that is essential, these boards, co-operating with recruiting officers, will take stock of all valuable labor; they will, in brief, determine who should or should not be recruited.

It is significant that the Militia Department is to have nothing to do with the new scheme. The work is taken from it and a separate organization created under the direct control of the Prime Minister.
