VIOLENT STORM IN SCOTLAND.

The Worst Rainstorm in 50 Years Has
Done Much Damage.

London, Oct. 13.—The most violent

Progress in Greek Macedonia.

Saloniki, Oct. 13.—British advance
guards have made some advance to the
east of the Struma river, in Greek
Macedonia, says the official statement

plored the region where the Seres-
Demir-Hissar railway joins the Seres-
Saloniki line, and found that the rail-
way was being strongly held by the
Bulgarians.

BISHOP CENSURES 'CLERICAL SPORTS'

United Brethren Prelate Raps Minis-
ters Who Go to Ball Games
and Bowling Alleys.

(Philadelphia Bulletin.)
Ministers who like to attend base-
ball games got no encouragement from
Bishop Wakely at today's session of
the United Brethren convention. The
Bishop made an appeal for higher
standards in the ministry.

"It's a crime to administer cologne
water and sleeping powders when the
soul is sick and on the brink of hell,"
he said.

"It's a crime to use some sort of ex-
ternal salve, when the scalp should
be used to cut but the cancer which
has fastened itself upon the inner
heart," he went on.

The Bishop deprecated ministers en-
gaging in any other line of work, even
in the church, involving the manage-
ment of finances.

"I am not at all in harmony," he said,
"with the theory that a preacher, to
reach and win men, must attend every
game of baseball that comes to town,
visit the bowling alleys and become an
expert checker player, or must quit his
studies and pastoral duties every now
and then and get off on a hunting or
fishing tour to the end that he may get
on the blind side of some tough old
sinner he chooses as an associate."

"The clerical sports will tell you
that Paul became all things to all men
that he might win some. But such an
interpretation of the Apostle's words
merely to justify their own fun-loving
propensities, is next to unpardonable.
Paul never did or said anything that
would license preachers to run with
the hares and hunt with the hounds."

\$225,000 FIRE NEAR PITTSBURG.

Prompt Arrival of Firemen Prevented
More Serious Conflagration.

Pittsburg, Pa., Oct. 13.—The prompt
arrival of firemen from Pittsburg and
near by towns prevented a more seri-
ous conflagration at McKee's Rocks, a
suburb, early today, when fire destr-
oyed the pattern and coach erecting de-
partments of the shops of the Pitts-
burg and Lake Erie Railway, the form-
er with valuable rolling stock, causing
a loss estimated by railroad officials
at \$225,000.

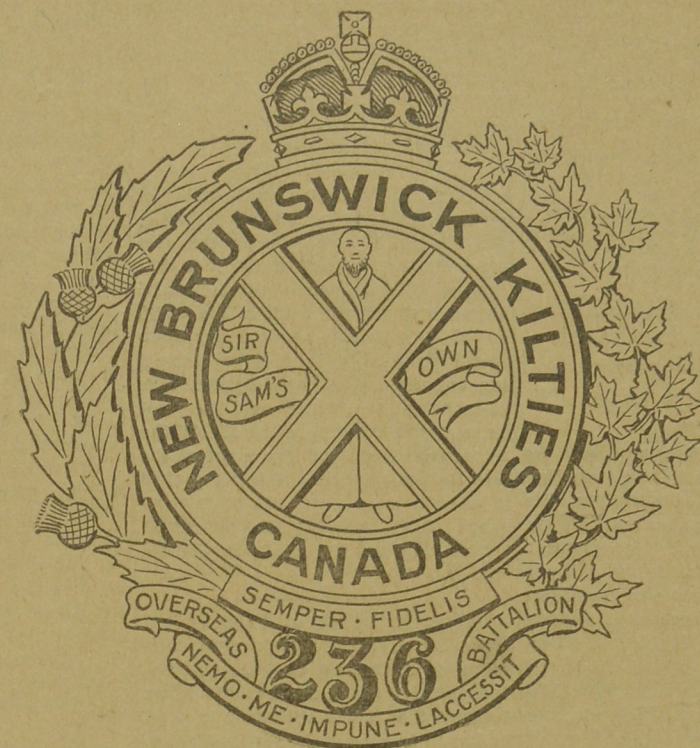
