Rev. J. S. Sutherland New Pastor of St. Paul's Church Will Arrive On Monday

Rev. J. S. Sutherland, the new pastor of St. Paul's Church, will arrive from St. John's, Nfld., with his family on Monday evening. The induction ceremony will take place at St. Paul's Church on Tuesday evening. Rev. Wm. Fraser, of St. Andrews, Moderator of the St. John's Presbytery, will preside. Rev. F. S. Dowling, pastor of St. Andrew's Church, St. John, will address the minister, and Rev. J. H. A. Anderson, of St. John's Church, St. John, will speak to the congregation.

The new pastor of St. Paul's is a native of Pictou, N. S., but has been stationed in Newfoundland for some time. He at one time held a pastorate in this province.

The authorities of the Brunswick Street Baptist Church have generously offered the use of their church to the Presbyterians in which to hold a reception to the new pastor. Since the Auld Kirk was removed, the Presbyterians have been lacking in facilities for congregational social gatherings.

A BRITISH STEAMER SUNK.

Was Bound From Scotland for Archangel—13 of Crew Missing.

London, Oct. 13.—The sinking of the British steamer Gardepee is announced by Lloyds. Twelve members of the crew have been landed. Thirteen are missing.

The Gardepee was 1663 tons gross, and was last reported as having sailed from Fraserburgh, Scotland, on Aug. 22, for Archangel.

BONNETS AND DOUBLETS ISSUED TO HIGHLANDERS

236th Now in Distinctive Uniform—Officers Mess Formally Opened.

The Balmoral bonnets and Highland doublets were issued yesterday to A and B companies of the 236th Highlanders. The doublet is like the ordinary infantry frock, except that it has a roll collar and is cut away at the bottom of the front.

The Balmoral is like a Tam-o-shanter and is khaki in color. A plume of gray and red feathers is pinned to the side. Soldiers who have served overseas will have red tips to their feathers.

The rest of the issue will be made today, but the kilts have not arrived in sufficient quantities to be issued.

The officers' mess of the 236th was formally opened last night. Major Frank Eason, adjutant and mess president, presided at the dinner. Sergt. Charles Wanamaker, of St. John, is mess steward.

Private Jack Barry has been promoted to corporal, and will be sanitary corporal. Private W. A. Waugh has been promoted to corporal and Private J. Thompson to lance corporal. All promotions are provisional.

Important Discussion in Enlistment Case

Quebec, Oct. 14.—In dismissing 12 writs of habeas corpus taken by parents of minors who enlisted without their parents' consent, Chief Justice Sir Francois Lemieux, holds that a minor can only be relieved for cause of lesion alleged and proved, and that enlistment with its usual consequences, drawbacks, etc., cannot cause a soldier what in legal parlance is called lesion.

RUSSIA AND JAPAN ENTER A PROTEST

Peking, Oct. 14.—Japan and Russia entered protests today against concessions for railway construction in China which have been granted to Americans.
