WOMAN'S COLUMN

TWICE COOKED SWEETS.

Wash sweet potatoes, but do not break the skins.

Put into boiling water, and cook slowly, keeping the water just at boiling point.

When potatoes are tender, but not soft, drain dry and arrange them in a baking pan without peeling.

Set them in the oven to dry.

Cooked twice the sweet potatoes are mealy and delicious.

Remove skins before serving by scraping with a dull knife.

GRAPE PUDDING.

Grape pudding may be either boiled or baked. Wash, pick and flour grapes before putting them into the batter. One heaping pint

of grapes makes a fair-sized pudding. For the batter. Beat the yolks of four eggs till thick, then add one cup of milk and two cups of flour. Add a cup of butter beaten to a cream, one teaspoon of vanilla extract, the whites of the eggs stiffly beaten, and then the grapes. Boil the pudding three hours and serve with rich sauce.

SWEET POTATO PIE.

Boil sweet potatoes with skins on. Peel when hot and slice. Line a pie plate with rich pie crust and fill with sliced sweet potatoes. Pour over this a small glass of brandy and about two teaspoonfuls of granulated sugar. Place small pieces of butter around and cover with top crust. This is delicious if made right. It should be eaten while

quite warm.

BLACKBERRY CREAM PIE.

One cup of blackberry jam.
One cup of sugar.
One cup of cream.
Four level tablespoons of flour.
Two eggs, separated.

Mix flour with sugar, add blackberry jam, the cream, and the yolks of the eggs, well beaten. Line a deep dish with a well-made paste rolled thin. Fill with blackberry mixture, and bake in a quick oven until the crust is set, continue baking in a slow oven until filling is thick and firm. Add a pinch of salt to the whites of the eggs, beat these until stiff, then gradually six level tablespoons of powdered sugar. When the pie is baked, remove from oven, heap meringue on top, and brown in a slow oven.

Oh what a tangled web we weave,

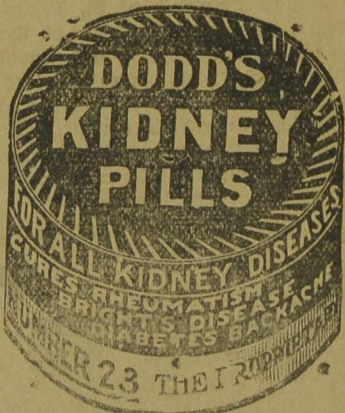
When first we practice to deceive,

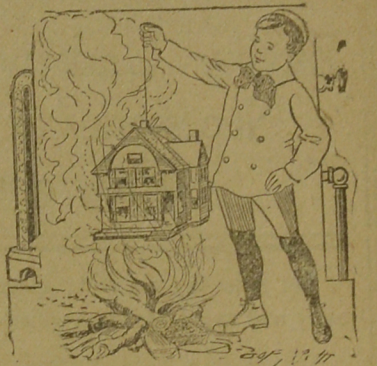
