CHOCOLATE FUDGE CAKE

Melt 2 ounces of bitter chocolate with 2 ounces of butter and 1-2 cup of boiling water. When cool add 1 cup of granulated sugar and one egg beaten with a pinch of salt. Sift one cup of flour with one-eighth teaspoon of baking powder and add to the first mixture with one fourth cup of sour or butter milk into which half a teaspoon of baking soda is stirred. Add a teaspoon of almond extract. Put in two eight-inch layer cake tins that have been buttered and bake in a moderately hot oven. Ice with butter, or boiled icing.

RASPBERRY AND CURRANT JELLY

4 1-2 cups (2 1-2 pounds) juice
7 1-2 cups (3 1-2 pounds) sugar
1 bottle pectin.
Use only ripened fruit and in equal amounts. Crush thoroughly, add 1-2 cup water, and bring just to a boil. Drip through jelly bag. Measure juice and sugar into large saucepan, stir and bring to a boil. At once add pectin, stirring constantly, and bring again to a full rolling boil and boil 1-2 minute. Remove from fire, let stand 1 minute, skim, pour quickly. Cover hot jelly with firm or hot paraffin; when jelly is cold cover with 1-8 inch of hot paraffin. Roll glass to spread paraffin on sides. Requires about 2 1-2 quarts (3 1-2 pounds). Makes eleven to twelve eight-ounce glasses.

CREAMED POTATOES

4 cups diced potatoes
3 tablespoons butter
Salt
Pepper
2 cups milk
1 cup cream
Melt the butter in a frying pan, add the potatoes and seasoning and stir over the fire until the fat is absorbed. Add the milk and cream and cook slowly half an hour until thick.

CHIFFONADE DRESSING

Standard French dressing recipe.
2 tablespoons minced pimento
2 tablespoons minced celery
1 teaspoon minced parsley
2 teaspoons minced onion
1 hard-cooked egg, finely minced
Mince the ingredients fine and mix with the French dressing. Serve with lettuce, endive or romaine.

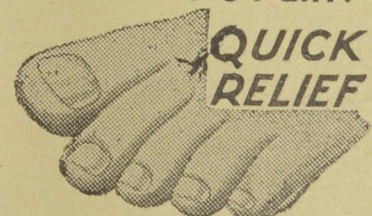
PINEAPPLE MOUSSE

1 1-2 teaspoons gelatin
2 tablespoons cold water
1 1-2 cups crushed grated pineapple and juice
1-3 cup sugar
1 cup cream
1 tablespoon lemon juice
Soak gelatin five minutes in the cold water. Heat the pineapple and juice to boiling point, add sugar, lemon juice and gelatin. Cool. When it begins to stiffen fold it into the stiffly whipped cream. Pour into tray and freeze without stirring.

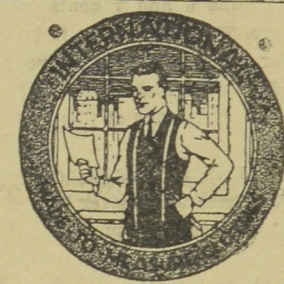
