POLISHED FLOORS.

If you have a waxed finish in the living room floor and wish to clean it put a few drops of crude oil on a soft dry cloth and give the waxed surface a light polishing after having dusted well with a dry cloth. To remove the cloudiness which comes over highly polished furniture, clean by washing with a sponge and tepid water, and rubbing dry with wet chamois wrung out of cold water. A dry chamois streaks the surface and does not remove the blur.

CARING FOR LEATHER CHAIRS

To preserve the leather in rockers and chairs, apply any oil. This will tend to make the leather supple and soft and prevent the drying out which causes the cracks. But a heavy application, such as petroleum ointment, would tend to discolor the leather. Moisten a cloth with milk and pass lightly over the leather surface about once a month, and, the furniture people tell us, the leather will be pre-

served.

TO CLEAN WHITE FUR.

Heat a generous quantity of new bran, stirring it constantly until it is thoroughly heated. Rub it into the fur, keeping the bran as hot as can be handled while using. Shake the fur and brush it briskly, and when this process has been repeated two or three times the dust and dirt will have vanished.

FOR FLOWERS IN WINTER.

To start bulbs for water flowers take a large wooden bucket, put several inches of dirt in the bottom, then sit your pots with the bulbs in on the dirt. Put enough dirt in the bucket to cover it at least four inches deep. In about six weeks examine them, and if they are one and one-half inches high take them out, but do not set them in the sun for several days. You will have better flowers if you do not take them out of the bucket too soon. This has been tried for years, and is all right.
