Mrs. Mabel Patterson, wife of Mr. Thomas Patterson, of Bear Island, passed away on Monday at the home of her daughter, Mrs. Wm. McCarthy, Upper Kingsclear. She is survived by her husband, three daughters and one son. The funeral took place today with interment at Macnaquac.

Now in France.

Sergt. Albert T. Fimmamore, of Fredericton, is now in France with the 26th Battalion. He enlisted at St. John in the 64th Battalion and went to England with it as a company sergeant major. He was an instructor in England, but left that position to get into action in France.

Late Grace Elliott.

Grace, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Jos. Elliott, of Marysville, passed away yesterday afternoon after a brief illness. Besides the parents three sisters and two brothers survive. The funeral took place this afternoon with interment at the Baptist cemetery, Marysville.

More Recruits.

The provincial recruiting office credits York county with thirty-one recruits for last week. Tuesday three recruits enlisted here. They were George Curle, 21, Westfield, for the 140th Battalion; Paul L. Kurring, 25, Ottawa, for the 236th; J. P. McGowan, 37, Stanley, for the 236th; Herbert W. Mid-Week Market.

There was quite a large display of farm produce in the market this morning and as usual good prices were realized. Potatoes were plentiful at 33c per barrel, chickens brought \$1.25 per pair, lamb \$1.50 to \$1.75, blueberries 80c per pair, cucumbers 30c a dozen, ripe tomatoes \$1 per basket, butter 30c, eggs 30c, carrots 5c per bunch, cabbages 7c each.

The Chancery Court.

Hon. Chief Justice McLeod presided at a sitting of the Chancery Court in St. John yesterday. In the case of Boylvs, Boyle, P. J. Hughes, of Fredericton, made an application for partition and dissolution of partnership, and an accounting. The hearing was stood over till Friday. In the case of Storey et al vs. Storey, P. J. Hughes moved for an order to have an injunction made perpetual. In this case the court considers and will give judgment this afternoon.

New Device for Crossings.

City Engineer George McKnight has devised a special gutter for street crossings which he claims will do away with inconvenience to the public in stepping over a curb and the inconvenience to the city employees of having to dig up pavement when the gutters freeze in the winter time. In Regent street his device forms part of the new concrete curb and gutter which has been laid. For uncurbed streets he has devised a special concrete form. The device is a trough which will be covered with a moveable top of planking. When the gutters freeze this top can be removed and the ice chopped out.

Four Soldiers in Confinement, to Join
140th Battalion at Valcartier--
First Recruits For Special Com-
pany of 236th.

Four soldiers who have got into trouble at various times and who have served sentences for different offences, are being given another chance to serve their country. They have been re-enlisted here and are to be forwarded to Valcartier to join the 140th Battalion. Frank Williams, 18, St. John, and James Mason, 25, St. John, who got into trouble with the local police last week, are two of the four. Both served formerly with the 115th Battalion.

The others are William A. Miller, 18, Gibson, and William D. McMillan, 29, Glace Bay. Both were serving sentences here for deserting from infantry units during the winter.

Two recruits for the special company which is to be attached to the 236th Battalion under the command of Major T. R. McNally were enlisted here today. They are Patrick Ryan, 21, Fredericton, and John J. McDonald, 23, Fredericton.

One recruit for the 236th Highlanders was also enlisted here. He is L. McC. Ritchie, 21, St. John.

**FRANK MERRYWEATHER
REPORTED WOUNDED
SECOND TIME**

Recently Spent Two Months in the
Hospital in France-- Left Frederic-
ton With First Contingent-- Draft
From 12th Battalion.

Mrs. Mabel Merryweather, of 89 Regent street, this morning received an official telegram from Ottawa notifying her that her son, Private Frank Merryweather, had been wounded in France.

Private Merryweather left Fredericton with the First Contingent. He joined the 12th Battalion at Valcartier and with it went to England. From the 12th he was drafted to a battalion fighting at the front.

This is evidently the second time he has been wounded, as he recently spent two months in a hospital in France as a result of a wound which was originally classified as slight.

During the time he was in hospital his mother received several letters from him which were forwarded by the British Red Cross society.

Private Merryweather is well known here. Before enlisting he was engaged in railroad construction.

But One Delegate.

A colored resident of the city, well along in years, appeared in the police court this morning on the charge of indecent exposure of his person. He pleaded not guilty, but was convicted on the evidence of Policeman Marshall, who arrested him yesterday afternoon near the Arctic Rink on the complaint of residents of Carleton st. 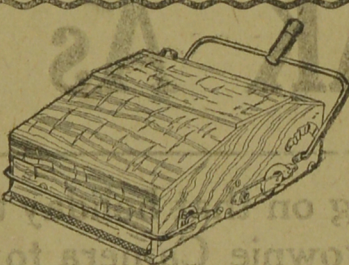
