INDUSTRIAL WORKERS IN FIERGE FIGHT AT EVERETT, WASH.

Seattle, Nov. 5.—The steamer Verona, which carried the Industrial Workers of the World expedition to Everett, returned here early tonight with four dead and twenty injured on board.

The vessel was met at the pier by a large force of police with fixed bayonets and ball cartridges, and after the dead and injured were removed all the passengers were marched to city jails and locked up.

The dead and wounded are the result of battle yesterday at Everett, Washington, 30 miles north of Seattle, where 250 members of the Industrial Workers of the World attempted to land from the Verona, which had carried them from Seattle.

The Verona was met by Sheriff Donald MacRae, of Snohomish county, who with a posse forbade the men to land. A shot fired from the Verona, according to the boat's officers, was followed immediately by firing on both sides. The steamer hastened back to Seattle with the dead and wounded.

The Seattle police took the dead to the morgue and wounded to hospitals.

Many Citizens Wounded.

One member of the Everett citizens' posse, C. O. Curtis, formerly a second lieutenant in the Washington National Guard, was killed, and nineteen others wounded.

Including the wounded there are 294 men and three women under arrest here in Seattle. Forty-one men were taken from a second steamer which failed to reach Everett. The women were taken from a motorbus which had been conveyed from the northern boundary of Seattle, where they had disembarked from an Everett inter-urban car.

The fight was a result of a long contest between the Industrial Workers and the citizens of Everett over the right to hold street meetings in that city.

The National Guard and naval militia at Everett and in Seattle are under orders to meet any emergencies.

The informant and Ernest Douglas were the witnesses examined this morning in the case against Fraser, who is charged with creating a disturbance by being drunk and fighting. The evidence was to the effect that the accused struck and knocked down his brother-in-law, a commercial traveller named Buzzell, and that he had been drinking. The case was resumed at 2.30 this afternoon.

About twenty witnesses from Stanley and vicinity came to the city by Intercolonial this morning and there is considerable public interest in the case. Rumors of legal action arising out of disturbances at the Stanley Fair have been current for some time. Besides the case now being heard, there is to be a case against Elbridge Fraser and also one against a man named Murray.

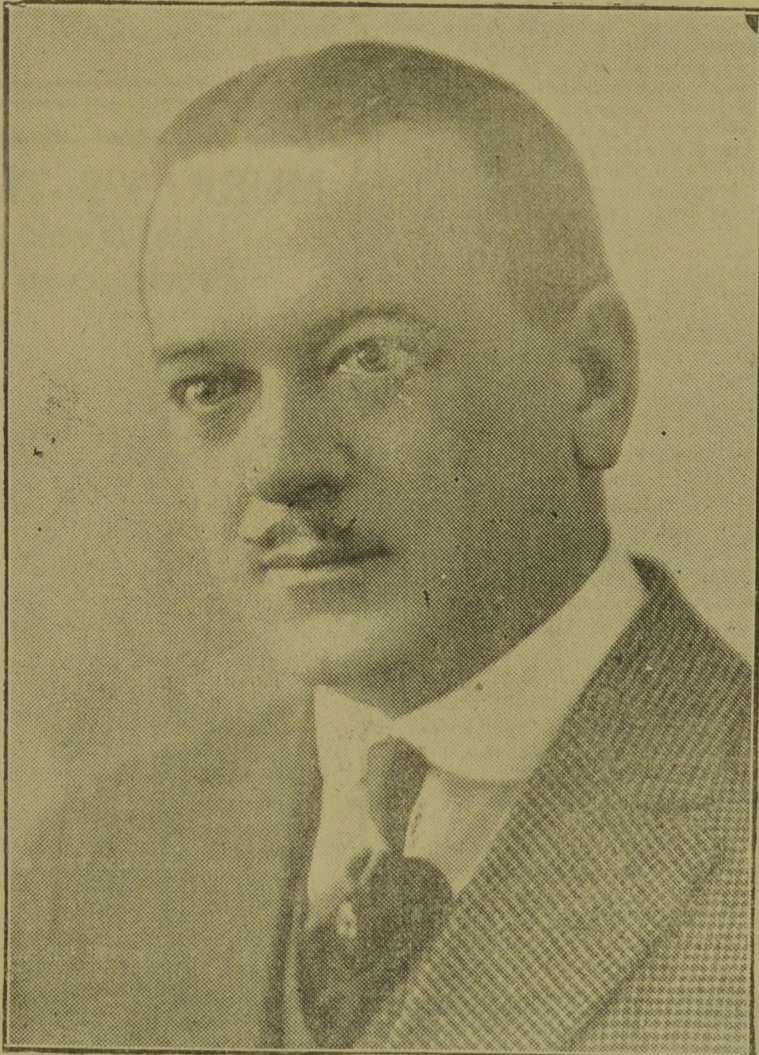
