**HISTORIC CHURCH
WAS DESTROYED**

Rome, Aug. 12.—The Church of Santa Maria Formosa was destroyed in the Austrian aeroplane raid on Venice on the night of August 10th. Nearly all of the works of art in the church had been removed months ago. The Church of Santa Maria Formosa was several centuries old. Its exact building date being unknown. It was remodelled in 1699. One of its altars was considered the masterpiece of Palma Verchio. Another altar was erected in 1473. The Church also contained Madonnas by Sassoferrato and Pietro Vassanina.

**ZEPPELIN RAID
ON PORT OF DOVER**

London, Aug. 12.—An air raid on the British naval port of Dover by two German sea planes, occurred this afternoon. An official statement says that four bombs were dropped, one officer and six men being slightly injured, but little material damage being done. Anti-aircraft guns came into action and aeroplanes went in pursuit of the raiders, who made off seawards.

**THE RUSSIANS
CAPTURE MORE
GALICIAN VILLAGES**

Petrograd, Aug. 13.—The Russian forces in Galicia have captured the town of Mariampol, seven miles southeast of Halicz, and farther north the town of Podgaicy, according to the latest Russian official communication issued this evening. The communication says: "Our crossing of the Rivers Stripa, Koropice and Ziota Lipa is continuing. We have occupied the town of Podgaicy. On the Dniester our cavalry captured the town of Mariampol. "During the operations one of our infantry regiments captured 12 officers and 1,000 men and seven machine and one trench guns."

Sweeping Through Galicia.
The Russian drive in Galicia goes forward unchecked and the War Office announced today a number of additional villages have been captured. Mariampol is the key to Lemberg. On the Upper Sereth we have gained possession of a series of fortified positions. The whole region of the main enemy winter positions before Tarnopol and Buczacz has fallen into the possession of the Russians, according to the official statement from general headquarters issued tonight.

Stubbornly Held Line.
The communication reads: "The fete day in celebration of the birthday of the heir to the imperial throne, the Grand Duke Alexis Nicholasievich, by a fortunate coincidence happened at the same time as the battering down of the fortified wall which the enemy erected last winter from the Pripiet river to the Roumanian frontier. "Today, ceding to the vigorous and determined efforts during the past seven weeks by the gallant troops under Generals Gerbachey and Sakharoff, under the leadership of General Brussloff, the villages of Gliadki, Verboleska, Cebroff, Czema and Pokropivna, all strangely fortified, fell into our hands. Further, Kosloff, southwest of Tarnopol, which was protected by the Burkanow forest and the whole line of the River Stripa, met the same fate. "Thus the whole region of the main enemy winter positions before Tarnopol and Buczacz, pressed by us on both flanks, fell into our possession."

BOER LEADER IS DEAD.
General Tobias Smuts, Who Fought in the Boer War. Capetown, South Africa, Aug. 12.—General Tobias Smuts, member of parliament, is dead. General Smuts was a candidate for the presidency of the Transvaal in 1897 against Paul Kruger. He took a prominent part in the Boer war.

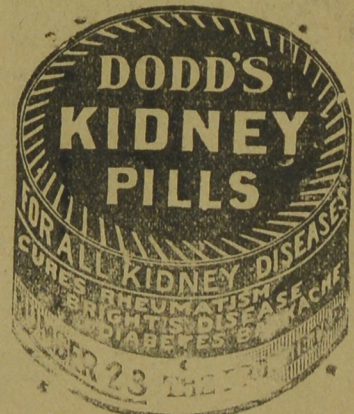

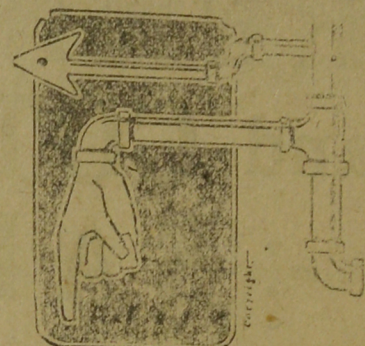
FOR RETURNED SOLDIERS.
