# SAYS COLBY CHARGES ARE EN-

To the Editor of The Mail:

Sir,-In the issue of The Daily Mail published here yesterday, there was printed an affidavit of E. C. Colby of Ottawa, containing the charges against me which were recently under investigation by a Commissioner on behalf of the Provincial Government.

I would like to point out in your paper that the publication of this affidavit by those behind the charges is apparently a distinct breach of the rules which have been laid down in this case by the Government. When the charges were preferred, and the investigation ordered, I asked that the hearing be open to the public, so that both sides of the story would be known. My request, for reasons which I cannot understand, was refused, but now, in violation of the rule made for this case, those who have preferred the charges have gone ahead with characteristic unfairness, and published the charges themselves 13 lbs Pure Cane Granulated and not the evidence, which evidence entirely refutes every portion of the charges.




