#### HOUSEHOLD RECIPES

Jellied Apples.

Six tart apples, 2 tablespoonfuls gelatin, juice of 2 lemons, 1 cupful sugar, 1 cup whipped cream, 1 cupful cold water. Peel, quarter and core the apples and cook without stirring until soft, but still hold share. Drain the apples and set aside to cool. Dissolve the gelatin in the water from the apples. Add the sugar and lemon gradually, 1 pint of hot milk, cook juice. Arrange the apples in a mold, pour the mixture over them and thick, remove from the fire and put on ice to harden. 
