TOO MUCH BARLEY USED FOR GERMAN BEER

Members of the I. O. G. T. in Germany Send a Protest Against It To the Chancellor.

Amsterdam, via London, July 14.—A protest against the consumption of barley for the making of beer is made in a letter sent to Chancellor Von Bethmann-Hollweg, signed by 8,000 members of Good Templar lodges in Germany.

The letter points out the "gigantic waste of bread material" in the use of large quantities of barley for the production of beer. It urges that hereafter beer be only supplied on bread tickets. The letter adds:

"Though the production of beer has been reduced to 48 per cent. of the pre-war quantity, there is still 42,000 hundred weight of barley used daily for brewing purposes. This would be sufficient to feed 10,000,000 persons. Your excellency is aware that for the production of one liter of beer 204 grammes of barley are necessary, while the daily bread allowance is only 220 grammes. Barley is bread material as much as rye or wheat. Common justice therefore demands that beer should be supplied only against bread tickets, although it would be better to completely prohibit beer except for the extent needed for the army.

The Frankfurter Zeitung features the letter and declares that idea is worth the most serious consideration.

DIVING GIRLS AIDED HEAT-PROSTRATION CASE

Aged Man Overcome at Show Grounds
---Attendance Continues Large.

The two diving girls who are the chief performers in the water show with the Williams' Standard Attractions, now showing at Queen Square, varied their usual programme of swimming and diving Wednesday afternoon by supplying "first aid" in a case of heat prostration.

The thermometer was well over 90 degrees in the shade Thursday afternoon. An aged man who is well known in this vicinity, was at the show grounds. Near the dressing tent of the diving girls the old man collapsed, rendered unconscious by the heat. The two performers were the only persons to observe the incident, and they went to his rescue.

After working over him for some time, they revived him. During Wednesday and Thursday many of the spectators were envious of the diving girls because their occupation kept them in such cool surroundings.

The Williams attractions continue to draw large crowds and all parts of the show are being well patronized. The heavy rain storm yesterday made the grounds soft and muddy, but did not interfere with the attendance.

ONLY A PEACEFUL MERCHANT CRAFT

Washington, July 14.—An advisory report on the status of the German merchant submarine Deutschland, submitted to Acting Secretary of State Polk today by the Government neutrality Board, is understood to hold that the vessel is a peaceful merchant craft and entitled to all privileges as such.

Indications now are that the State-Depaourngdda will make no formal announcement concerning the submarine, but that the Treasury Department will be advised to permit her to clear and sail from Baltimore whenever her captain desires to start on his return voyage.

MORE DEATHS FROM INFANTILE PARALYSIS

New York, July 14.—A marked increase in both the number of new cases and deaths in the infantile paralysis epidemic during the last 24 hours was shown today in the report of the health department.

During the 24 hours period ending at 10 a.m. today, there were 162 new cases and 31 children died from the disease in the five boroughs of New York.

Brooklyn has the greatest number of new cases in a single day since the epidemic began on June 26. There were sixteen deaths and 122 new cases in that borough.

INVALIDED SOLDIERS ARRIVED AT HALIFAX

Halifax, July 14.—Most of the invalided officers and soldiers who arrived here yesterday by steamer from England have left for their homes. A number left by special for Montreal.

HEAVY FINE IMPOSED ON BRITISH STEAMER

Manila, July 14.—The collector of customs has imposed a fine of 50,000 pesos on the British steamer Chinese Prince. A bond was filed pending an appeal to the courts and the Chinese Prince will bear on Saturday.

The Chinese Prince, New York for Penang and other eastern ports, was seized on July 11, as she was about to sail from Manila for Vladivostok, and a fine of 1,000,000 pesos was imposed on account of the fact that 2,000 packages consigned to Manila were missing. The packages were confiscated by the British authorities at Penang. After imposing the fine of 1,000,000 pesos the collector of customs granted a hearing in the case, resulting in a reduction of the fine.

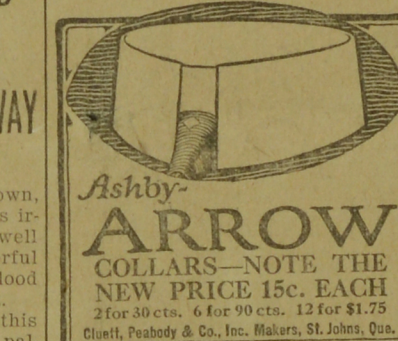

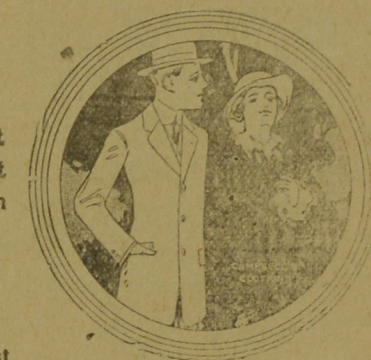
