

## Beatrice Redpath

ALTHOUGH Canada is still too young a nation to have a literature distinctly Canadian, she is producing today writers of such merit as to attract the attention of the outside world. In poetry, particularly, she has begun to blaze her own trail, such writers as Bliss Carman and C.S. D. Roberts having won recognition from all who know true inspiration. Different from these and yet even more thoroughly Canadian, for she has remained true to Montreal, is Beatrice Redpath, whose recently published volume of verse "Drawn Shutters," was described in T. P. O'Connor's well-known literary review as "coming like sunshine amid clouds, themselves noble and impressive." The poems of Mrs. Redpath are typical of the quiet dignity of Mount Royal with its stately trees, below which the world lies spread in a mysterious beauty. No name is better known in Montreal than that of Redpath, but the author of "Drawn Shutters" was born to the name of Peterson, daughter of Alexander Peterson, C.E., engineer of the C.P.R. bridge built across the St. Lawrence at Lachine in 1886, and Chief Engineer of the C.P.R. when the Ste. Annes and Vaudeuil bridges were built and the great railway bridge at Sault Ste. Marie. "One of the best railway engineers in the world," said the "New York Times" of her father. "One of the truest poets of our time," might well be said of Beatrice Redpath.

LLOYD-GEORGE'S  
FIRST ARMY ORDER

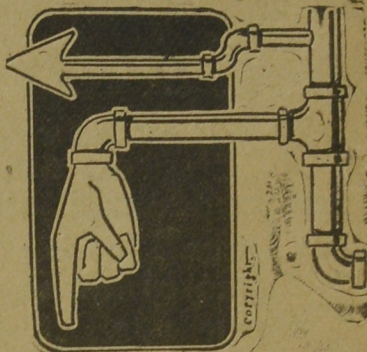

SUMMER HOME BURNED

London, July 14.—The Royal Chateau at Tatoi, Greece, occupied as the summer residence of King Constantine, has been destroyed by fire, says a Reuter despatch from Athens. The King, Queen Sophie and members of the Royal Family escaped and took refuge with Prince Nicholas at his home in Keppassi.

The fire started in a forest near the Chateau and spread to that building and to the adjoining barracks of the rural police, which were destroyed. Several lives were lost in the burning of the barracks.

Where the shrapnel bursts and the bayonets sweep.

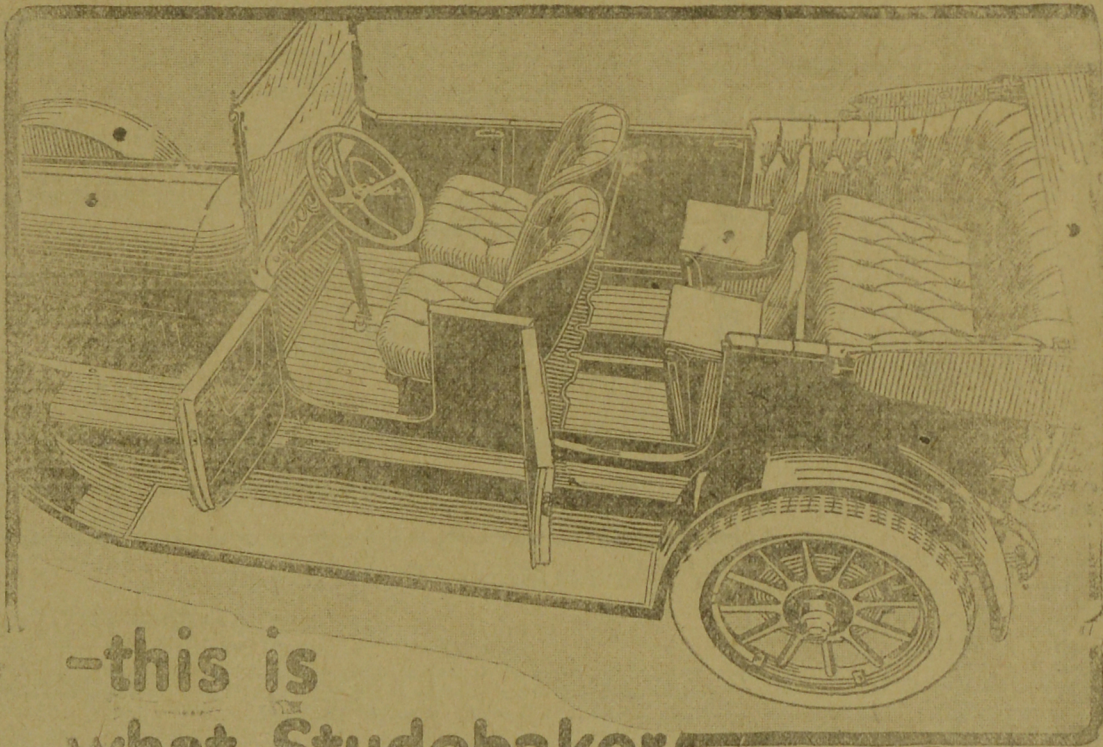
One lies quite still where a trench yawns deep.

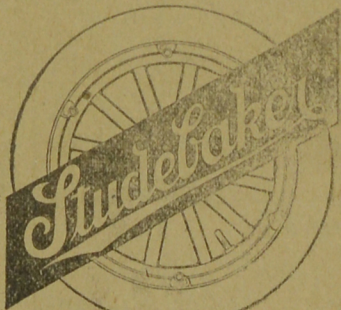
