PHILLIES SIGN

CHIEF BENDER FOR
ONE-YEAR TERM

Indian Pitcher Jumped Last Year to Federals-- Was Formerly with the Philadelphia Athletics.

Philadelphia, Feb. 11—"Chief" Bender, one of the star pitchers on the Philadelphia American League team when they were world's champions, will reappear in major league company in the uniform of the Philadelphia National team. He agreed on terms for a one-year contract today at a conference with Pat Moran, manager of the National League title holders.

Bender joined the Athletics in 1903 and jumped to the Federal League last season after Manager Mack had asked waivers on him and his other veteran pitchers, Plank and Coombs. Baltimore released the Indian pitcher in the middle of the season after he had lost sixteen and won four games.

New Orleans, Feb. 11—Sam Langford of Boston, tonight knocked out Harry Wills of New Orleans, in the nineteenth round of a twenty-round fight, before 3500 fans. He stabbed and jabbed Langford's nose throughout the fight and in the fourteenth had Sam in a bad way. Langford depended most on a right hook to the jaw, with an occasional vicious left and it was one of these that did the trick.

WILLARD WILL GET

That \$47,500 Purse For A Ten Round Bout Figures Out at That Amount.

If Tex Rickard pays Jets Willard \$27,500 for a ten-round bout with Frank Moran, the champion will receive \$1583.33 for every minute of the thirty he boxes.

At this rate an eight-hour work day would net Willard more than \$700,000, while at the end of a working year of three hundred days, Willard would receive about \$228,000,000. The President of the United States received \$75,000 per year; the United States ambassador to England \$17,500; the chief justice of the United States Supreme Court \$15,000 and Congressmen and Senators \$7500 each.

Kaiser's Son To Wed
Some Time This Month

(Canadian Press.)
London, Feb. 12—A despatch to the Exchange Telegraph Company from Amsterdam says that Emperor William has announced his decision that the marriage of Prince Joachim, youngest son of Emperor William and Princess Marie Augustine, daughter of Prince Edward of Anhalt, was officially announced in Berlin on October 14, 1915. It has since then been unofficially stated that the wedding would take place during the present month and that the ceremony would be extremely simple. Prince Joachim who was twenty-five years old last December 27, is a captain in the 14th Regiment of Hussars, in the Foot Guards, the Grenadier Guards and several other military organizations and is the only unmarried one of the Emperor's six sons. Princess Marie Augustine is a niece of the reigning Duke, Frederick II of Anhalt, and was born on June 10, 1898. It has been reported that her father is fighting under Crown Prince Frederick William, brother of the prospective bridegroom on the Argonne front.
