#### RURAL CREDITS.

One of the questions, says the Mont real Journal of Commerce, which have attracted much attention in our west ern country is the high rate of interes and the difficulty of the farmer in ob taining financial assistance in the car rying on of his work. As respects mortgages, the lowest rate of interest in Manitoba is 7 per cent. Higher rates are paid in some parts of that province and in the provinces of Saskatchewan and Alberta. The terms of mortgages too, are deemed severe, repayment be ing called for within a short period usually five years. As respects other credits the grievance was that the banking system, while well adapted to assist the manufacturer and merchant, did not adapt itself to the needs of the farmer.
