





THE U. S. DRAWING

Washington, Dec. 21.—Secretary of State Lansing today authorized the following statement:

The reasons for the sending of the note were as follows: It is not our material interest we had in mind when the note was sent, but more and more our own rights are becoming involved by the belligerents on both sides, so that the situation is becomingly increasingly critical.

I mean by that, we are drawing nearer the verge of war ourselves, and therefore we are entitled to know exactly what each belligerent seeks in E order that we may regulate our conduct in the future

No national alarm has been sounded. No consideration of the German overtures or of the speech of Lloyd George was taken into account in the formulation of the document; the only thing the overtures did was to delay it a few days. It was not decided to send it until Monday. Of course one of the difficulties before the President was that it might be construed as a movement toward peace and in aid of the German overtures. He specifically denies that that was the fact in the doc uments.
