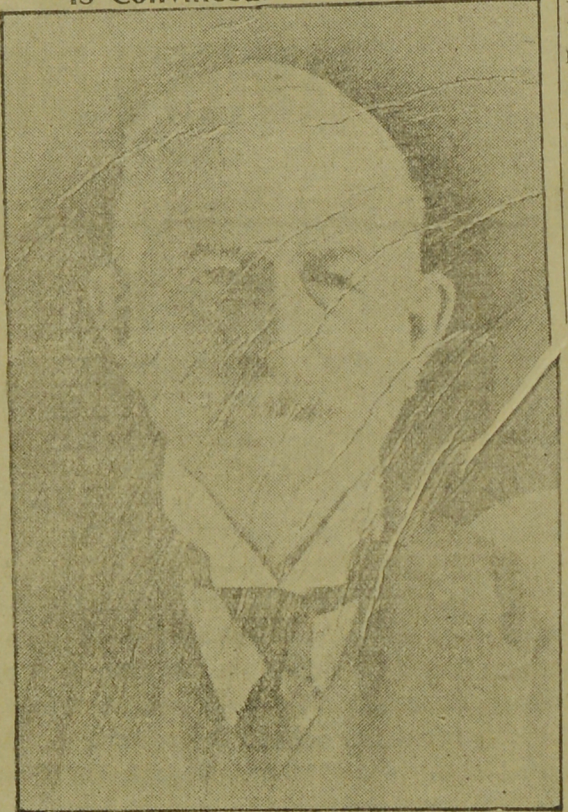


## FRENCH IN THE SCHOOLS

Should Be Compulsory, Lord Shaughnessy Is Convinced.

INTERVIEWED in London, Lord Shaughnessy, president of the Canadian Pacific Railway Company, stated his conviction that it was essential to the development of Canadian trade that both French and English should be compulsory subjects in Canadian schools, and that though other languages might be optional the more languages learned the better.

He said: "The subject of trade after the war is one in which Canada is deeply interested at the present moment. Of course we are pre-occupied just now with the successful prosecution of the war, but at the same time it is possible to frame in our minds the general outline of our trade policy. When hostilities are concluded we must not be content to develop scientific research alone, but amongst other things in connection with trade after the war greater attention should be paid to the universal instruction in schools in foreign languages. In the past we have been content to give our boys and girls just adequate education in their own tongue. If the lessons of this war are to be taken to heart, and if we are to extend our trade then we must make our youngsters familiar with the language of other nations, and, in my opinion, the French language should be made compulsory in every common school throughout the Empire. For it is the most common medium in exchange of thought all over the world. Russian and Italian should also be studied."

## SIR SAM'S SCHEME NIPPED IN THE BUD

Canada's War Lord Wanted Sir Max Aitken For Overseas Minister Of Militia.

(St. John Telegraph.)  
That the resignation of Sir Sam Hughes, Minister of Militia, was the result of a combination of difficulties in which the present government found itself, was the analysis placed on the present political situation at Ottawa by F. B. Carvell, M.P., who was interviewed last night by the Telegraph.

"I don't think that Sir Sam is any worse than his government," he said. "There is no way for the government to get rid of the unpleasant fact that the scheme of the Conservative party from the beginning of the war was to make political capital out of it, so far as possible. Every person who sold goods had to sell through the middle man and so be run through the political machine."

"Sir Sam just happened to be the man in the limelight when he started after the Militia Department, and they voted everything down by brute force, but it reached a point in the end when public sentiment began to stand against something had to be done, and the government picked out this militia council scheme in London as a sort of way out of it."

New Brunswick the Worst.  
"While Sir Sam played his own game in the war, every toy politician in Canada was playing the game too, for all he was worth except on a smaller scale, and in no place in Canada has it been played so viciously as in the province of New Brunswick."

Asked as to who he thought would likely fill Sir Sam's shoes, Mr. Carvell said that he believed A. E. Kemp was the man who would probably be given the position. He expressed the opinion that Mr. Kemp would make a bid for the appointment and in all probability land it.

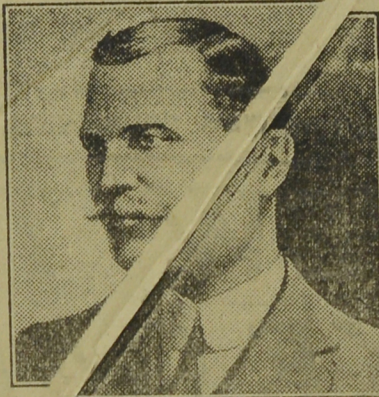
"This is a government of the big interests," he added by way of explanation, "and the man who has lots of money and belongs to the moneyed aristocracy, is the man who Borden wants with him. It is the high tariff wing of the government that sways it, and that is the reason I believe that Kemp will get the appointment as Minister of Militia."

Asked if he thought the government would take any action in the matter of the high cost of living, Mr. Carvell replied:

"The appointment of a commission to investigate would, from the experience of the past few months with commissions, show us plainly that the government does not mean business."

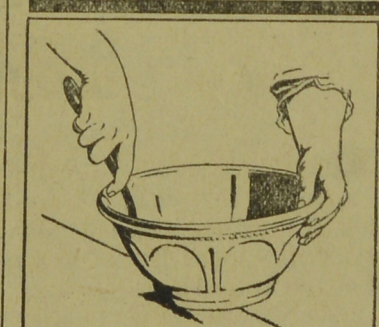
