## THE QUEBEC BRIDGE NEARING COMPLETION

The Big Centre Span to be Floated  
Into Position Next  
Month.

Ottawa, Aug. 18.—Arrangements are being made to float into position between September 14th and 16th the giant centre span of the Quebec bridge, which is to link the two cantilevers.

This will pave the way for the opening of the bridge early next year, and the final completion of one of the engineering marvels of the century.

The big span has been assembled at Silley Cove. It weighs 650,000 tons, has a length of 600 feet, a width of 100 feet, and is 160 feet above the water.

The parts of the old bridge which had then been erected, collapsed in September, 1908, when nearly a hundred workmen lost their lives. The best experts obtainable were afterwards engaged in working out the new plans. The cost of the old and new works together will be around \$35,000,000. The work has been in progress since 1905.

## CONTINUED BELGIAN SUCCESS IN GERMAN EAST AFRICA

Havre, Aug. 18.—A brigade of Belgian troops has captured and occupied the port of Karema, on the eastern bank of Lake Tanganyika, German East Africa, says an official Belgian announcement. Karema is about 125 miles south of Ujiji.

Several others living in Lower Truro and having hay on their marsh land were losers by the flooding of the land by the sea water.

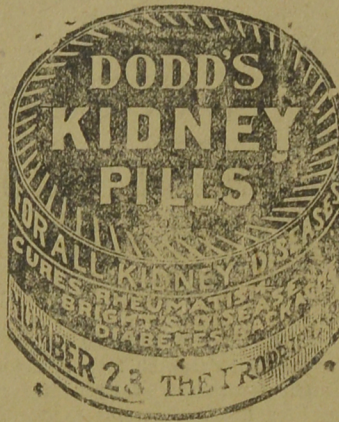

## Public Schools Notice.

FOR the special benefit of pupils who have reached Grade VI and who are unable to continue the common school course, the Trustees will open a pre-vocational department in the York Street School building. Applicants for admission to this department will file their names with the Secretary and obtain an admission certificate.

In accordance with the Compulsory Schools Act, all children from six to fourteen years of age must be in attendance at school. In every case the reason for non-attendance must be given to the Board of School Trustees by the parent or guardian of the child.

In pursuance of Sec. 73 of the Schools Act, the Secretary is required in every case to demand a physician's certificate or other evidence of recent successful vaccination before a permit may be issued.

All the schools will be re-opened on Monday, 25th inst., at 9 o'clock, a.m., and permits may be obtained at the office on York street during the previous week. Applicants for admission to the Model School, whose names have been registered, will apply for permits on Friday, 25th inst.

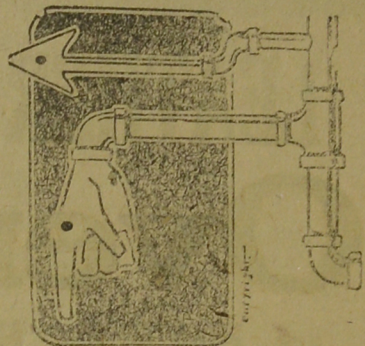
