Hartford Woman Charged With Murder

Hartford, Conn., May 10.—With Mrs. Amy E. Archer-Gilligan locked up in an isolated cell at the Hartford county jail, charged with murdering Franklin A. Andrews, a patient at her home for elderly people at Windsor, state police and county officials today continued their investigation into other deaths at the home.

The police assert that at least twenty deaths have occurred at the home under suspicious circumstances in the last five years.

Poison is alleged to have caused Andrews' death. The police and State Attorney Alcorn decline to discuss any details of the investigation. Efforts made by newspaper men to see Mrs. Archer-Gilligan were unavailing. It was said, however, that she retains her remarkable composure and emphatically avers her innocence.

Admit the Sussex was Torpedoed

Amsterdam, May 10 (via London).—A semi-official despatch from Berlin says that as the result of the German government's investigation concerning the explosion which damaged the steamer Sussex, it can no longer be doubted that the vessel torpedoed by a German submarine on the supposition that it was a warship, was in fact the Sussex.

The despatch says that the German government has acquiesced the United States government with this fact, adding that in accordance with the note of last month, Germany will draw its conclusions from the evidence that has now been adduced.

German Report Via Sayville

BERLIN, May 10 (by wireless to Sayville).—The Germans have made further progress on Hill 304, on the Verdun front, and have driven back French detachments southwest of the hill, the War Office statement of today says.

WINNIPEG AVIATOR KILLED IN ACTION

Winnipeg, May 10.—Lieut. John Dennistoun, a young Winnipeg aviator, was killed in the air on May 4th in a flight over the enemy's lines, according to a cable message from his father, Lieut. Col. Max Dennistoun, commanding the 53rd Battalion, now in England.

NO CANADIAN TROOPS ARE NOW ON THE SEA

Ottawa, May 10.—No Canadian forces are now at sea. This announcement was made officially this morning and disposes of the report which has come successively from different quarters in the past week, that a Canadian transport has been sunk.

All the ships carrying our soldiers are now safely landed, and none of them met mishap.

MUST NOT PROMOTE CHARITY BALLS

New York, May 10.—A news agency despatch from Rome today says:

"The consistorial congregation today published a decree confirming the decision of the third Plenary Council of Baltimore, forbidding priests to promote charity balls.

The decree particularly directs the attention of American and Canadian bishops to the decision.

DOES NOT APPLY TO CANADIAN SETTLERS

Ottawa, May 10.—Officially speaking, the State Department today would not place a definite interpretation on the meaning of the London cable making the official announcement that "all married Englishmen eligible for military service who are living abroad, but who are ordinarily residents of Great Britain, must return to England forthwith and report for military duty."

"All we know of it is what we have seen in the papers," stated the best authority of the department, "and unless something detailed is received I would not care to give an official opinion.

"My private view, however, is that it applies clearly and exclusively to Englishmen who are domiciled in Great Britain, but who for some reason or other are temporarily residing or staying abroad.

"I do not consider that it has any application at all to married Englishmen who have settled in Canada and are permanently residing here."

TOOK MOVING PICTURES.

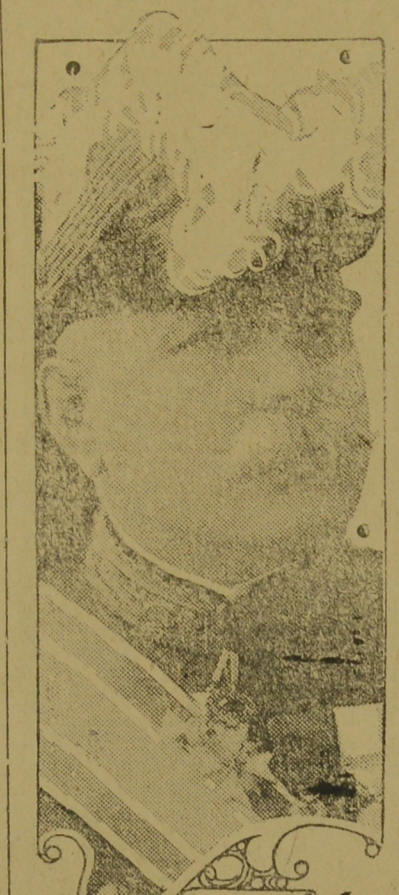

SOLDIER MARRIED TODAY.

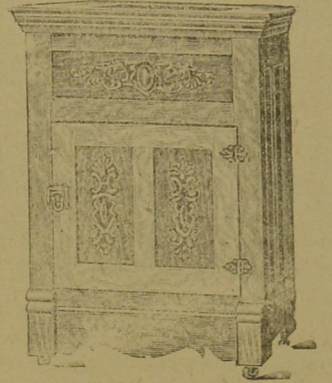

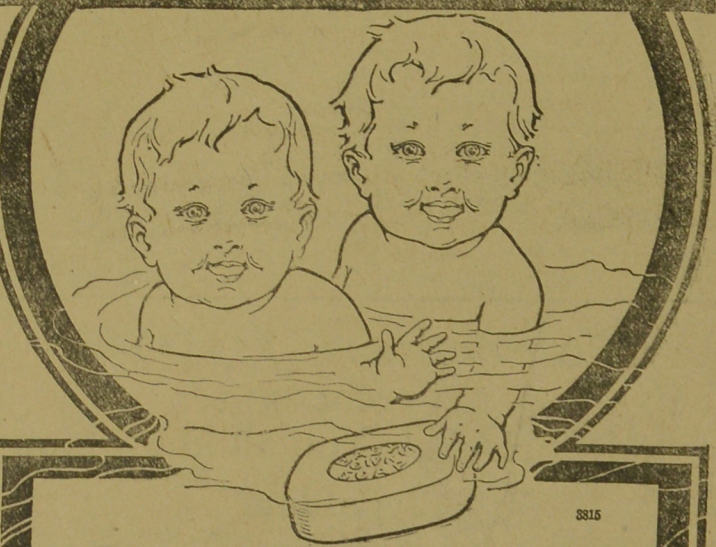
